-After the Meeting, Ralph Irizarry, Division 5 SO-MT, spoke on the the Waterway Watch program. Safety on the water is the number one priority. There are approximately 12 million registered boaters and 20 million additional boaters. The Waterway Watch involves many aspects of Homeland Security. Suspicious activity on the water should be radiod in on channel 16, then switching to a secure channel to report continued observation. The programs objective is to tap in into local knowledge of boaters. Everyone is part of waterway safety.

A Maritime Observation Mission (MOM) is a non-law enforcement mission whose goal is to prevent acts of terrorism and other illegal activities. One mission under MOM is Operation Small Fry, involving Auxiliary vessels following a foreign-flagged ship when requested by the active duty Coast Guard to keep an eye on the vessel. Of course, extreme care must be taken by the Auxiliary to avoid any conflict.
