New York Boat Show 2020

The 2020 New York Boat Show was held from January 21st to January 26th at the Javits Center with Flotilla 5-11 participating, along with members of other flotillas.

The setup crew arrived on the afternoon of January 21st led by AUX David Mooney, Vice Division Commander for Division 5.
Auxiliarists quickly coordinated with other members of the crew to assemble an eyecatching exhibit.

The tables were arranged in three parts:

- 1. Part one (left portion of photo), was geared towards children. We utilized a model to teach children nautical names of different parts of a ship (port, starboard, bow, stern, bridge) and literature to rouse the interest of kids to safe boating and environmental protection of waterways
- 2. Part two (center of photo) was dedicated to literature on safe boating and promoting the USCG Auxiliary. We also had samples of personal floatation devices (PFD or life vest, to use the common terminology)
- 3. Part three (right of photo) was purposed for Coast Guard career and Academy opportunities

AUX McNamara, who worked as a member of the setup crew and assisted AUX Barth with Coast Guard recruiting, said the display booth "received quite a few visitors who were interested in all components of the Coast Guard, as well as the U.S. Coast Guard Academy."

AUX Jose Peña, Flotilla Commander for Flotilla 5-04, who served as an Auxiliarist-in-Charge, said of the enthusiasm, "By week's end, we ran out of printed materials! That's always a good sign that we are engaging our audience."


This was a great example of how we engage our public in a variety of topics.

Cold Water Boating

The traditional boating season is set to begin in three short months! For those who enjoy winter boating, please be sure to check the weather, including the water and air temperatures before heading out. Be sure to also monitor the conditions during your voyage. While your day may start out sunny, a sudden cold rain could soak you and bring on hypothermia. Carry pocket warmers, an extra change of clothes, a thermos filled with a hot drink or soup. Please be sure to have everyone in your party wear a properly fitted life jacket as well!



Communication Devices

For reliable on-the-water communications be sure to carry a fixed-mount or hand-held VHF Radio. A VHF radio can be your lifeline to the world in a time of need. While underway, be sure to monitor VHF Channel 16, which is the international distress channel. The United States Coast Guard maintains a listening watch on this channel, along with other vessels and most coastal stations.
