Station Cape May - Watchstanding (ongoing need)	You can train to become a Communication Watchstander at STATION CAPE MAY. You will monitor all radio communications in our area and be the voice that the public hears when they contact the STATION. This allows Active Duty personnel to train in other areas. Coast Guard 87' Cutters – Serve as the In-port Officer of the Deck (ongoing need)	This can be a rewarding task as you actually serve as the In-port OOD representing the Officer in Charge (OIC). You will be responsible for all aspects of the ship while it is in port. Generally, Auxiliarists serve four hours shifts but they can be longer if you wish.
