## 2018 District 5 Southern Region Statistics




Have you ever heard someone say, or heaven forbid, have you ever said, "I forgot to submit my hours this month but I don't guess that is a very big deal. Who would care anyway? What could they amount to?"

We have all seen our own commitment statistics and we may have seen our own Flotilla's hours but have you ever wondered what the District does as a total?

At S-Train on April 6<sup>th</sup> in Yorktown Commander May, DIRAUX, quoted the following statistics of the approximately 2,300 active members in D5SR. This is what was accomplished in 2018:

- 245,000 Recreational boating Safety (RBS) hours
- 950,000 miles driven supporting RBS
- \$117,000 out of pocket expenses supporting RBS
- 11,317 Vessel Safety Checks (PC/Paddle Craft) 87.9% pass rate
- 4,235 Marine Patrol / SAR missions
- 10,077 Marine Patrol / SAR hours
- 261 ATON/PATON missions
- 555 Aton/Paton verified
- 364 discrepancies reported
- 9,564 Marine Dealer Visits
- 285 Commercial Fishing / Uninspected Passenger Vessel Exams
- 7,307 Radio Watch stander hours
- 2,712 Watch standing hours
- 298 Public Education Courses to 6,129 students; 3,070 under the age of 17

These numbers speak loudly about what we as a TEAM do for the boating community. Without the USCG Auxiliary, all of us, these jobs could not be done in the same manner. Be Proud of what we do in support of the USCG and please be sure to submit your hours every month so these numbers reflect all we do.


## **Celebrate Arbor Day**
