Flotilla 3-10 celebrates the 100th birthday of former Coast Guard member

The U.S. Coast Guard Auxiliary Flotilla 54-03-10, along with the **Richmond County Sheriff's Office and** Fire Department celebrated the 100th birthday of former Coast Guard member Marguerite Grace Brackett Spear on September 18, 2021 at her home. With lights flashing and sirens on, the flotilla members were escorted to her home. The members of Flotilla 54-03-10 presented her with a certificate of appreciation for her service during World War II and the Sheriff's Department presented her with a Challenge Coin from their office and a round of Happy Birthday was sung by all who attended.









Marguerite Spear was born on Labor Day September 5,1921 in Richmond Virginia and grew up in Washington D.C.



When World War II broke out in 1941, Marguerite surprised everyone who knew her by joining the U.S. Coast Guard in Washington. She was one of the first women to join the "Semper Paratus, Always Ready" or SPARs. She joined the Coast Guard because it was the smallest in numbers of the military services. She had to gain weight before they would take her which she accomplished by drinking many milkshakes. She was sent to Hunter College in New York for boot camp, then to yeoman school in Oklahoma along with other Coast Guard members. After yeoman school, she was sent to New York City. After arriving in Manhattan, she

was assigned to the intelligence division of the Coast Guard, and was introduced to the man whose position she was taking. Marguerite was an ace stenographer, accompanying investigators, taking notes and transcribing them later. Always busy, she enjoyed her service to this nation. She served in Manhattan until the war ended in September,1945. When the war ended, Marguerite walked to 42nd Street and could barely move because it was so crowded.



After the war, she went to work at the Federal Bureau of Investigation but when the Office of Strategic Services became the Central Intelligence Agency, (CIA) Marguerite went to work there and retired from the CIA. Each place she worked she found was interesting and kept her very busy.

After her career in Washington, she moved to Montross, Virginia. She enjoyed traveling, which as an avid reader, she still does through her books. Marguerite, being a woman of faith also became active at her church.

Marguerite says that the older she gets the more fascinated she is with people's behavior and the less she understands it. Even at 100, Marguerite has a very sharp mind and a very quick wit. One of her favorite sayings is "it's a wonderful life if you're strong enough to get through it".
