Amy Thomas of Flotilla 33 was sworn in for her second term as Division Commander; Eric Perkins of Flotilla 31 was similarly sworn in as the Division Vice Commander. Division 3 generally covers the Richmond, Petersburg, Kilmarnock and Callao/Montross areas. There are 123 members in the Division spread among those areas in Flotillas 31, 32, 33, and Flotilla 3-10

Callao Flotilla 3-10 received many of the awards and special recognition during the awards presentations. The Flotilla placed second in the average number of hours volunteered by members across the broad spectrum of Auxiliary missions on land, on the water, in classrooms, and in training to maintain or improve capabilities supporting the Coast Guard itself. Its total commitment was over 9,300 hours. It placed first in the categories of Vessel Safety Checks, Recreational Boating Safety Program Visits, and Public Affairs. The Flotilla placed second in the Division in the area of Public Education. It also placed second in Operations.
