FLOTILLA 3-10's AID VERIFIERS AND COXSWAINS MEET WITH ANT POTOMAC

All of Flotilla 3-10's Aid verifiers (AV) and Coxswains met with ANT Potomac Chief BM1 Thompson, and two of his team members 8 February. The team arrived at the dock adjacent to Charlie Thomas' home utilizing their station boat.

BM1 Thompson had requested the meeting so that he could share the new Coast Guard emphasis on Private Aids in District 5 SR. Acknowledging the failures of the past, he was quite refreshing and enthusiastic.

The ANT team was clearly prepared, and brought updated reports for all Private Aids that Flotilla 3-10 is responsible for in AOR 15 and part of AOR 16. The updated reports showed that the recent reports Charlie Thomas had turned in the previous week for East Cod Creek were already entered into iAtonis. The verifications needed for this year were clearly identifiable in the reports, albeit many were verified in the last several years but not entered into the database.

This is the first time anyone from ANT Potomac has done this kind of outreach, and was greatly appreciated by the AV's and Coxswains in attendance. It would be advantageous if Sector Hampton Roads could generate the same type of outreach and reports for the other flotillas in Division 3, which doesn't appear to have been done in the past.

BM1 Thompson mentioned that they could possibly do training for us; such as the PQS work we did here last year. There were questions about also assisting with the basic AV course for new members, and he thinks he may be able to, but was going to look into this.


