USCG Flag Presentation Patrick McConnell

Last Spring, Flotilla 87 had the honor of attending the Military Ball sponsored by the Orange County High School's Junior Reserve Officer Training Corps, the Montpelier Rifle Battalion. One thing that was missing during the festivities was the Coast Guard flag; flags from the other armed services were displayed. During the remaining year, Flotilla 87 acted to correct this situation!

On Tuesday January 10, 2017, Flotilla 87's Eric Hartwig, Flotilla Vice Commander, Ron Sims, Human Resources staff officer, and Pat McConnell, Public Affairs staff officer, visited the school's JROTC, the Montpelier Rifle Battalion to present the Coast Guard flag to the cadets. Getting a break from their Standards of Learning tests, roughly 30 cadets participated in a ceremony during which they saw a Coast Guard video and heard from the Flotilla trio about the Auxiliary's mission and people. The group also heard from Coast Guard Reserve Chief Petty Officer Wright, a teacher at the school.

The Montpelier Battalion is commanded by Major Kent Daniel (U.S. Army, retired) and First Sargent Charles McIntyre (U.S. Army, retired). Under their guidance, cadets are instilled with a sense of accomplishment while building self-esteem, teamwork, and selfdiscipline in each of the students. The Montpelier Rifle Battalion Cadet "mandate" of leader character is defined as: "one that is Skilled, Tough, and Ready around the Clock (STRAC)-academically, physically and mentally; one that is Caring, Competent, and Committed to those they lead; one who can Think Critically about consequence of decisions and actions; a quiet professional held in high esteem out of respect of character because they can always be trusted to Tenaciously Lead by Example with Zeal - 24 hours a day, 7 days a week."

The Orange County High School JROTC program was established under the authority of Public Law 88-64, in the ROTC Vitalization Act of 1964 and Army Regulation 145-2. It was formally brought into service by Paragraph 1 of General Order #9 Headquarters, Department of the Army, dated 20 May, 1985.

Since its' beginning on the 20th of May 1985, the Cadets of Orange County High School have taken historic pride in referring to themselves as the Montpelier Rifle Battalion (MRB) JROTC. According to legend, during the Revolutionary War, some of the local militia referred to themselves as the "Montpelier Rifles". This was in association with the Montpelier Estate and its owner James Madison who is known as the "Father of our Constitution" and later, 4th President of the United States.
