Vessel Length	Class
Less than 16 Feet	Class A
16 - 26 Feet	Class 1
26 - 40 Feet	Class 2
40 to less than 65 Feet	Class 3

Vessel length is measured from the tip of the bow in a straight line to the stern. Does not include outboard motors, swim platforms, ladders or anything that is not part of the molded hull.

Who may operate?



South Carolina

Persons 16 years of age

or older:

- May operate any boat or PWC without restrictions.
- Persons younger than 16 years of age may operate:
 - A boat or PWC powered by 15hp or more *only if:*
 - ◆ They are accompanied by an adult at lest 18yrs old who is not under the influence of alcohol and/or drugs

or...

♦ They have passed a boating safety course approved by the South Carolina Department of Natural Resources.



Georgia

Who may operate?


Persons less than 12 years of age:

- May not legally operate any vessel 16 feet in length or longer.
- May legally operate a vessel less than 16 feet long an powered by a motor of 30hp or less *only if* they are accompanied by a competent adult.
- May legally operate any non-motorize Class A vessel.


AUXDATA Time & Expenses - Form 7029

Report from VFC/FSO-MT Lindsey

In mid-April presenting the Recreational Boating Safety message at the Lake Keowee In-Water Boat Show. For this we had use of the new Sector Charleston BAT-PAK Lite demonstration trailer (aka Boating Advisory Trailer-Public Awareness Kit). The BAT-Pak trailer is wrapped in a boating safety. lifejacket and Waterway Watch message and opens up to display a variety of Children's, Adults and even pet lifejackets plus other safety equipment including signal flares, strobes, and personal locator beacons. Many have also seen the trailer when we had two display locations at the Upstate Boat Show at the T.D. Convention Center in January, and we made use of it again at the Lake Hartwell Poker Run.

The trailer is self-contained so can run on 'shore power, solar cells or an included electric generator. Other features include a monitor for showing boating safety videos, and a laser fire extinguisher simulator which has gotten widespread public use. During the Poker Run, Ronnie Merritt performed double duty by using the VFH Marine Radio station for watch standing while Boating Safety patrols were providing safety support, primarily to boats

entering and leaving Portman Marina.
