And a word from our Vice Flotilla Commander; Kiko Picornell

The year is very fast coming to an end. As your Vice Flotilla Commander, I can't tell you how impressed with the amount of work everyone put into Flotilla 56's activities, and the results clearly show it. I want to thank all the Flotilla Staff Officers for an excellent job in their respective responsibilities along with the ENTIRE membership who time and time again showed up and got those jobs done. This year our new membership has grown by leaps and bounds, and I look forward to all the new members settling into the roles that interest them. We are also being more proactive in mentoring new members, and I think we shall see the fruits of those efforts next year.

Two things I would like to mention is the introduction of the Alternative Work Uniform (AWU) and the start of yearly uniform inspections.

The AWU can substitute for the Operational Dress Uniform (ODU). It is NOT a substitute or alternative to any other uniform including the Tropical Dress Uniform (Trops) or AuxAir flight suits. Additionally, AWU's can be worn for the purpose of instructing virtual and in-person public education classes, performing boating safety partner visits, and for public outreach events (e.g. boating safety booths at boat shows; public outreach information tables at National Safe Boating Week events0. The AWU is specifically not authorized to be worn for ceremonial events (e.g. as part of a color guard or in parade formation).

There is a new Uniform Inspection Policy. It outlines that, "An annual requirement is established for Auxiliarists to undergo a uniform inspection by either their Flotilla Commander, Vice Flotilla Commander, Immediate Past Flotilla Commander or other elected officer in their Chain of Leadership and Management (COLM). Multiple opportunities shall be provided for Auxiliarist to undergo this inspection. Elected Officers in another Auxiliary COLM may also perform and attest to an Auxiliarist's uniform inspection. This requirement shall be effective starting CY 2024.

This is a good time to brush up on your uniforms and wear them with Pride.



Several hundred coloring books were passed out to children and candy "LifeSavers"-pun intended – to the adults. Have you ever thought about how many passwords you have as an Auxiliarist? There are five different login passwords to cover the nine different Coast Guard Auxiliary websites you may use.

Let's look at the top three passwords that everyone needs to have and use. Use a unique password for each website.

Member Zone Password

The first login that you need to have is called a member zone password. This uses your ID number as the user name. The password is 8 characters long. It is used by all of the WOW websites, which include your flotilla website, the

division website (cgauxdivision7.com), and all of the directorate websites. You generally can recognize where the member zone password by the entry form.

USCGAUX Password

Second is your USCGAUX password, also used by three different websites. USCGAUX also uses your ID number as the username. It is important for all of your training. It is used by the National Test Center (ntc2.cgaux.org/NTC), and the Auxofficer/Auxdirectory (auxofficer.cgaux.org/auxoff/)and the Moodle classroom (classroom2.cgaux.org/moodle) . This password must be a

minimum of 10 characters with upper and lower-case letters, numbers, and special characters. You can recognize it by the graphic they use for the USCGAUX password.

AUXDATA II Password

The third important password is for AUXDATAII (uscg.experience.crmforce.mil/auxcommunity). This is the only place this password is used. It uses your email address as the user name. For example <u>2365689@uscg.aux</u>. It requires a strong password. It also requires you to change it periodically, about every 60 days.
