




April 28, 2013 Durney Key Island, Florida

On Sunday April 28 Pasco County Parks and Rec department along with Paddling Pasco held the 1<sup>st</sup> annual Durney Key Challenge. This was a 2.3 mile paddling race course around several Stilt Houses and in open water starting and ending on Durney Key. Unlike a traditional race this event included 10 unique challenges testing paddling skills and endurance. The challenges included many turns and obstacles to paddle around and over, and one that required the paddler to get out of their boat and then get back in. It was a timed event but was designed for a novice to be able to accomplish the tasks and have fun.

Robert Smallwood had volunteered Flotilla 11-6 to help early in the planning process of the event given the concern of the venue being in a major boating area between the Cotee River and the Anclote North Sand Bar. Flotilla 11-6 provided two facilities- (BobCat-Robert Smallwood) and (Norm Robertson's PWC) for traffic and crowd control along the race course. Given the course covered over two miles of open water the Pasco Sherriff and FWC also where there to provide Law Enforcement and visibility to the event. Some of the course was over shallow areas, so BobCat patrolled the deeper western end of the course while Norm's PWC was a better choice on the shallow east side.

The event started around 1030, and given a strong southeast breeze it was a challenge for the participants as they paddled into the wind for the first mile of the course. For many of the novice paddlers, this drained a lot of their energy. The return path to Durney Key contained all the course obstacles including maneuvering around the Stilt Houses. Mid-way through the event, in the area of the course where most of the obstacles were located Norm saw that a paddler had flipped her kayak. Her life jacket was not secured properly, it had slipped over her head covering her face and she began to panic. Norm knew he needed to respond. He could have called out for help, but given his training and situational awareness he knew that his PWC could get to the paddler quicker than anyone else. Norm did not hesitate, quickly got the paddler out of the water, made sure she was ok, attached her kayak to his PWC and took her to one of the Stilt houses where the race officials were. The race course officials made sure she was ok, and due to the competitive nature of this Paddler she wanted nothing more but to get back into the race. Norm made sure her life jacket was secure this time and she finished the race.

This is truly an instance when one of our own possibly saved a life. Thanks to Norm and his quick/decisive action ensuring the event ended with all participants safe and accounted for.
