Flotilla Tests Domain-Specific Email System by Randy Patton, FSO-CS

New FSO-CS Randy Patton reported that he has acquired the internet domain name of "uscgauxfl.org" and has configured full-featured IMAP (Internet Message Access Protocol) email accounts for bridge officers and a few others who have specifically requested this type of email account, as well as "forwarding-only" email addresses for all FSOs in the flotilla.

Some of the advantages of this system include:

- One group email address to send email to all bridge officers
- One group email address to send email to

all members

- A professional and consistent set of email addresses, including a dedicated flotilla address, to appear on public documents such as *The Compass Rose* and our unit website.
- The potential for future expansion to provide uscgaux-fl.org email addresses for any flotilla member who would like one.

The popularity of Auxiliary units acquiring these domain addresses is apparent from the rapidly dwindling availability of appropriate domain names. So far, this test has been going well, and updated reports will be forthcoming at future meetings.
