It's almost impossible to summarize the accomplishments of
Division 15 in a single newsletter! Our members have stepped up

and accomplished a multitude of missions in supporting Station Yankeetown, the boating public, and the communities in which we live. It's actually a disservice to attempt to mention their success for fear of omitting many of their other outstanding accomplishments!

Each year countless hours are devoted to the auxiliary's core principle of Recreational Boating Safety which is highlighted with their involvement in National Safe Boating Week. Along with these functions, our members excel in providing free life jackets to children, taking a leadership

role in community events ranging from local fairs, blessing of the fleet, and boat shows. They also conduct the *Annual Douglas Munro Memorial Event*, which honors the only member of the Coast Guard to be presented the Nation's **Medal of Honor**.

Working hand in hand with Station Yankeetown, Division 15 members provide Food Services support, stand radio watch, provide backup support when Rescue 21 is down, and a number of other activities. The division sponsors the Station Yankeetown Annual Chili Tasting Contest, their Annual Ethnic Luncheon, and helps plan the Annual Coast Guard Birthday Picnic. Our members developed a "Caps for Coasties" program in which all of the station's crew were presented with "Station Yankeetown" ODU ball caps. As new crew members come aboard, they also receive a station cap. A member of the division is the Station's Ombudsman, who greets new arrivals and their families as they report to station. The MAYDAY is a monthly web letter sent to the Station crew's families.

There are also the additional activities which so often go unmentioned -- aiding in pollution control, shoreline clean up, retrieving discarded crab pots, working hand in hand with county EOCs, and countless other community involvement programs.

To say that our members are dedicated is an understatement. Division 15 is "SERVING FLORIDA'S NATURE COAST"

Interactive Calendar added to Division 15 Website

By clicking on the calendar tab of the Division 15 website you will notice that a second calendar has been added. The original PDF calendar is still there with all the Division 15 Dates listed. In addition, an interactive Google calendar has been added. The Google calendar displays the current month but permits you to scroll forward or back using the arrows at the top of the calendar. The primary reason the interactive calendar was added is its capacity to display more detailed information for a particular date. If you click on one of the Member Training dates, you will notice that the time, location and other relevant information can be displayed for that event. The PDF calendar is limited to the amount of information that can be fit into the date box whereas the Google calendar provides more flexibility. Some of the other features of the interactive calendar are related to its display and printing options. You can display the current month or week or a simple 'to do' style listing of events.
