Diversity

The U.S. Coast Guard developed a policy to support and educate its membership on the essentials of diversity, in the performance of its mission. The U.S. Coast Guard Auxiliary follows the established policy and practices of its parent body, by implementing the diversity policy, in its workforce composition and program delivery.

Within the broader context of American life, diversity refers to the complex, multiethnic, and racial groups. There are subsets within each defined group. When applied to membership or workforce,

diversity is broadly defined as inclusiveness, without regard to physical limits or arbitrary designed limits.

Each flotilla of the Auxiliary is charged under the general policy of the U.S. Coast Guard to prohibit and defeat attempts to exclude persons from its membership, and full participation in its mission, based on group biases and group perceptions. The limits to perform each function in the Auxiliary must be based on an individual's success or failure to grasp the elements of a specific assignment. Each flotilla fails or succeeds, as a

measure of its ability to utilize its available personnel and resources.

A diversity course (under civil rights) is mandated as a prerequisite to membership in the Auxiliary and must be repeated every five years. Flotilla 7-4 will hold periodic classes on diversity throughout the year. We welcome the participation of other flotillas in our diversity training offerings.






Warrior Weekend-Port O'Connor
