2019 Wings Over Texas Deployment

District 7 in Corpus Christi, April 12th to 14th

Starting April 12th and ending Sunday, April 14th, four crews comprising US Coast Guard Auxiliarists throughout district Eight Coastal Region, including divisions seven, six, and five, all converged at NAS Corpus Christi for the *Wings Over Texas* airshow. The three-day mission defended the temporary protection zone along the northern sea wall, running east to west at the base's northern edge. This protected zone was designated as an emergency ditch or bailout area for the pilots participating in the airshow at is was critical to keep recreational boaters clear of potential hazards.

The sea states of Corpus Christi Bay varied throughout the weekend. Friday's practice run started with three to five-foot choppy waves, pushing the crews to regain their "sea legs" hastily. The two boat crews working that day accomplished area familiarization, established multi-boat communication protocols, and a sense of comradery.

Saturday proved to be a new day with greater challenges as the crews assemble and launch all four boats. Working alongside a Coast Guard twenty-five-foot patrol craft, the auxiliary took position to guide recreational boaters from penetrating the protected zone, with the focus on eastern edge.

DCAPT Stromer's crew was on parade as they brought a VIP onboard, the Chief of Naval Education and Training, escorted him to center stage, and asked him kindly to depart into the water. Not to worry, it was all part of the show and the crew seen below stood by while a Coast Guard HH65 Dolphin swooped in with a rescue swimmer and performed an at sea rescue demonstration. This event was repeated on Sunday with equal success.

As weather worsened throughout the day, the deployed vessels adjusted as needed. The crews cautioned recreational boaters in less capable craft to take refuge in safe harbor. Heeding their own warnings, the smaller two craft of the four-boat squadron also returned to harbor, maintaining safety at the forefront of operational success. The crew resource management extended beyond a single boat crew and was implemented at a squadron tactical level.
