In Memoriam of Officer Eric Mumaw

Our condolences to family friends and fellow first responders of Metropolitan Nashville Police Officer Eric Mumaw. The 44-year-old 18-year veteran of the Metro Police department drowned in the Cumberland River in the early hours of Feb. 2, 2017. Officer Mumaw had twice before received awards for heroism.

Larry Carter, member of the Auxiliary and former Metro Police officer worked with officer Mumaw. "He was a great officer and I could tell he was a real people person". It has been said, that is why he stayed on the night shift, where he felt he could do the most good. It was a tragic turn of events in which officer Mumaw lost his life attempting to save that of another.

"Any time we lose an officer it affects us all, we are like family". "When we put on a badge we never know what the next call will be, but it is a calling to a proud profession protecting and serving our communities" Carter said. "Often times when I



am out, People will say "Thank You for Your Service" My reply is "Thank You for Your Support." May we remember that when someone thanks us for our service, and may we not forget Officer Mumaw's heroism as we strive to keep our AOR safe for all.
