AUXAIR 11-04 Training at Air Station Mobile AL





This past August, DIRAUX issued orders for two members of our Flotilla to attend their required annual Water Survival / Aviation Training and Safety Workshop. Training was held at the U. S. Coast Guard Aviation Training Center Mobile, Alabama.

Steve Campbell, Aircraft Commander, and Jim Williamson, Aircrew/Observer made the trip via AUXAIR from Gallatin Tennessee to Mobile Alabama where they were joined by twelve other aviation members of District Aviation 82nd Squadron.

During the first day of training, they were welcomed and briefed by the base commander, Captain MacDonald, Lieutenant Hughes (incoming AUXLO) and Lieutenant Williams (outgoing AUXLO).

The training and review included subjects in Aeromedical/Spatial Disorientation, Crew Resource Management (CRM), and the annual Swim/Egress water survival training at the base swimming pool with Coast Guard rescue swimmers standing by.
