POLICY FOR TRAINING SEA SCOUTS AND BOY SCOUTS

The purpose of this policy is to provide guidance to Auxiliary members who wish to participate in Sea Scout and Boy Scout training programs specified in the Coast Guard Auxiliary's Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) with the Boy Scouts of America.

The safety of all participants in these programs is of paramount importance and prudent steps must be taken to insure the safety of all who participate in these training activities. Applicable Coast Guard Auxiliary policies apply at all times as do all applicable Sea Scout and Boy Scout of America policies. Auxiliary participants must be qualified Coxswains or Crew Members to be involved in these programs.
