- Flotilla Commanders Update: Ben Gardiner
 - COVID-19: All Members are asked to thoroughly review Auxiliary COVID-19 Reconstitution Guidance – Version 3. There is some very significant information in that document.
 - The Coast Guard now requires full COVID-19 vaccination for Coast Guard Auxiliarists when assigned to duty that involves in-person interaction with Coast Guard personnel (including other Auxiliarists), other government personnel (federal, state, and local), or members of the public.
 - "Unvaccinated Auxiliarists (including partially vaccinated) remain able to volunteer for any assignments or activities that do not involve in-person interaction with members of the public, other government personnel, or Coast Guard personnel."
 - Individuals are considered vaccinated two (2) weeks after their second shot of a 2-dose vaccine or two (2) weeks after receiving the dose of a one-shot vaccine.
 - Auxiliarists should consult their personnel physician if they have a question about whether they should be vaccinated or not
 - Further, the Coast Guard and Auxiliary is still working on the process for determining medical and religious exemptions from vaccination

- Pretty much count on masks and social distancing whenever indoors. The Guidance
 Document provides a listing of other protective measures for missions depending upon the
 level of Covid cases in a particular area
- Coast Guard Station Leadership and appropriate elected and appointed Auxiliary Leaders
 are now empowered to ask Auxiliarists if they have been vaccinated or not if that knowledge
 would have an impact on the safety of the personnel assigned to duty.
- Certification of Vaccination Form. The form is available through the links in the document and is apparently intended to document whether an Auxiliarist has been vaccinated or not. It is mentioned specifically as required to enter Coast Guard and other Federal Buildings.
 Personnel are expected to fill it out and have it on their person if they intend to enter a Coast Guard building.
- It appears the Coast Guard wants missions, including those involving contact with the public to proceed this year because they are aware of the negative impact on the Boating Public by our absence over the last two years. We can expect close scrutiny by USCG OIA's to determine the Gain v Risk for our missions.
- No decision has been made yet whether currency requirements in terms of hours or other considerations will be waived this year.
- Division Financial Officer Don Campbell and Division Secretary is Tony Scaglione
- In process of putting together an accurate inventory of PME for Division, especially unassigned equipment.
- Future Division meetings will be done via Zoom for the foreseeable future.
- Division Meetings are open to all Auxiliarists
- Division Reports due around 15th of Month
- Flotilla FSO meeting in two weeks.
- Operations Update, Ben Gardiner
 - Jamie Cornell has been appointed to the Flotilla Operations Officer Position (FSO-OP). Jamie was a small boat coxswain in the US Coast Guard and is active in a Marine Services consulting firm.
 - As you know we lost a total of 3 operations personnel to transfers to Flotilla 2-14 (Lewis, Wik-Grimm, and Zdan). This leaves us short of coxswains in particular. But we will address this and anticipate Flotilla 22 will be back on the water before the end of the 2022 season. It will take considerable effort but believe it is doable.
 - Boat Crew Training. Kim will be canvassing the Flotilla to determine if we have members interested in Boat Crew Qualification. This a large commitment in time and effort and if you believe you are interested, please advise Kim Walsh, FSO-MT.
- 2022 Missions. In addition to our return to Operations and Marine Safety Missions we will look to engage the Boating Public with our Recreational Boating Safety Missions.
 - We should look to increase our effort in Public Affairs, Public Education (PE), Vessel
 Examinations (VE), distribution of RBS literature and information to the boating public, and
 commercial and governmental organizations through the RBS Visitation Program (RBSVP).
 - This offers many training and mission possibilities for our Membership.
 - Discussions around the Flotilla starting a Personal Watercraft Class and Paddle Craft qualifications.
 - Fellowship: Christmas Party was a tremendous success.

Addendum to minutes

Division 2 Update: Meeting of 03 January 2022

- Called to Order by DCDR Bob Shanahan and VCDR Rick Kunz.
- Auxiliary Unit Coordinator (AUC): Richard Kunz. He is the liaison with Station Oswego and at least for now all communications with the Station go through him.
 - Flotilla 2-2 Members on Division Staff: Division Finance Officer (SO-FN) Don
 Campbell and Division Secretary / Records Officer (SO-SR): Anthony Scaglione.
 - PPE Inventory (Operational Personnel): Rick Kunz is coordinating the PPE Inventory for now but expects to appoint Jim Middleton (7-4 Oswego) as the Division RSS Officer to oversee PPE and PLB's. PPE inventory is due to Rick by 31 January 2022.
 - ✓ Rick wants everything counted both assigned and unassigned equipment.
 - ✓ Unassigned PPE and PLB's are supposed to returned to Division for redistribution.
 - It is particularly important to identify PLB's whose batteries are expired or about to expire.
 - ✓ Rick wants a list of PPE Needs for each Flotilla.
 - ✓ Rick said he would be sending out an email with more specific instructions.
 - Flotilla 22 is currently working on this with RSS Officers Robinson and Every. We will meet deadline and hope PPE needs are met better than they have been the last couple of years.
 - COVID: Follow State and CDC guidelines but expect Station Oswego to have final word.
 Steve Botsford suggested that decisions on Public Events from Commodore level may require at least 1 month lead time.
 - More guidance was received on COVID on 06 January 2022 when Auxiliary COVID-19 Reconstitution Guidance – Version 3.
 - Future Division Meetings. Likely to be Virtual for the immediate future.
 - Meetings are open to all Auxiliary Members regardless of their position. We will make links available to our Membership.
 - Monthly reports to Division by 15th of Month. Our schedule from last year of FSO reports will work for this schedule.

Tompkins County Sheriff's Marine Patrol Unit



The County Sheriff's patrol plays a vital role in boating safety on Cayuga Lake. A review of 2021 activity logs on their website shows they were active on the lake from May through October, with 19 calls reported. Entries include incidents described as: "boat overturned"; "property damage – boating accident"; "assist NYSP"; "trash in lake"; "assist stranded boater"; "harassment"; "assisted disabled vessel"; "boating accident"; "vessel in distress" and "dispatched to a dispute."

The Sheriff's most recent annual report (2019 & 2020) gives an excellent overview of their activities and capabilities.

The Marine Patrol unit focuses on boater safety and enforces navigation law. The Sheriff's boat is also used for search and rescue operations and investigating crimes. This unit is partially funded by New York State to help offset the cost to the Sheriff's Office.

A Marine Patrol Deputy is required to attend two 40 hour intensive Marine training courses. Currently, the Tompkins County Sheriff's Office has 10 officers certified in Marine Patrol. These Deputies work as law enforcement Deputies year round, and are assigned to the boat less than 75% of the time.

Our Marine Patrol focuses on the southeastern part of Cayuga Lake (Tompkins County) to ensure a safe, fun, and enjoyable experience for everyone. You can find our 2004 Wellcraft Sheriff's boat on the water during weekends and holidays from Memorial Day into September.

Fire Extinguisher Requirements Changing

"The Coast Guard is amending portable fire extinguishing equipment requirements for recreational vessels that are propelled or controlled by propulsion machinery. We are relieving owners of these recreational vessels from certain inspection, maintenance, and recordkeeping requirements of National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) 10 (2010 edition). These requirements are more suited for commercial vessels. This rule does not alter standards for commercial vessels including vessels carrying passengers for hire, or have any effect on recreational vessels that do not use propulsion machinery.

This rule also moves fire extinguishing equipment rules for recreational vessels from subpart 25.30 (Fire Extinguishing Equipment) of subchapter C (Uninspected Vessels) of title 46 of the Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) to part 175 of subchapter S (Boating Safety) of title 33, where other recreational vessel rules already exist..."

ODU Uniform Changes on the Horizon

As you may have already read in a Nov 2021 post by Ben Gardiner on our Facebook page, the USCG will be phasing in new ODUs. The instruction of the new style was delayed by supply chain issues, and is now expected to begin at the end of 2022 with the old style phased out by 2025. There hasn't been an announcement yet on when the Auxiliary will adopt the new ODUs.

The updated version appears much like our current ODUs, but sizing and some detail have

changed. According to Military.com, "The two-piece uniforms will be the same for both men and women, with blouses sized by chest measurement and shirt length, and trousers sized by waist and inseam. Unique features that aren't available on the current operational dress uniform include a Mandarin collar that allows for quick shifts to battle conditions; a rank tab that can be switched out after a promotion, rather than embroidery that needs to be

tailored or requires a uniform replacement; an extra pocket; self-blousing trousers; and spaces for organizational patches." (https://www.military.com/daily-news/2021/11/15/new-working-uniforms-coming-coasties-later-next-year.html)
