The Coast Guard Auxiliary usually serves our citizens in quiet ways. That service has not gone unnoticed, however!

Without much local fanfare, in January 2021 the US Department of Homeland Security announced a Coast-Guard-wide award in recognition of its many contributions. If you check your record, most of you will find that as of Feb 7 2022 you received the DHS Outstanding Unit Award (OUA).

The award was given for outstanding service during multiple hurricanes, the national response at the Southwest Border, and the COVID 19 global pandemic for the period of Aug. 25, 2017, through Nov. 30, 2020. According to the description published here, the citation also praised the "exceptional resilience of the Coast Guard during the fiscal year 2019 35-day partial government lapse in appropriation and the courage, resourcefulness, and professionalism of our people."

The award was given to both Coast Guard and CG Auxiliary members. All but four of Flotilla 2-2's members (our newest members) received this award.

This is an important recognition of the Coast Guard's work, and your part in it. We all serve where and when we can. Remember that we have two members who are in both the CG and CGAux. We also have a qualified interpreter and a FEMA disaster recovery specialist. All may have been posted to disaster areas, or exposed to increased Covid risk during this period. One of our newest members did not qualify for this award, but has volunteered for Culinary Assistance duty at the Southwest border.

Here at home, we all did the best we could to carry on our mission in the face of pandemic restrictions and the uncertainty of the government "shutdown". Our members overcame many obstacles to continue meeting, training, teaching, patrolling, expanding their qualifications and maintaining readiness and fellowship.

ODU Notes

Ben Gardiner, FC, FSO-Ops



The ODU is the basic working uniform. ODU's are worn during operational missions, such as on-the-water activities or vessel safety checks. For a complete description of the ODU, see Chapter 10, Section H.4 of the AUXMAN.

ODU Wear Notes (Based on common mistakes):

- The Ballcap MUST be worn. No exceptions.
- The t-shirt MUST be coast guard blue.
- All tapes (i.e. nametape) MUST extend completely across the width of the pockets.
- Boots MUST be bloused.
- Sleeves may be rolled up, but it MUST be done only during proper times of the year, and MUST be done using the "official" sleeve-rolling method.

Boat shoes may be worn, but only when underway on an Auxiliary Facility.

Member Training Minute – Maintaining Qualifications

Training is extremely important in the Coast Guard Auxiliary. As discussed in the annual Team Coordinated Training workshop, activities within the Coast Guard, and the Coast Guard Auxiliary, are often dynamic and complex, and occasionally dangerous. Thus it's important to complete at least the required minimum training to maintain your knowledge of continuing and new requirements and safety factors.



For Vessel Examiners / Instructors, this usually means an annual Workshop and completing at least the minimum number of Vessel Safety Checks (VSCs), Marine Dealer Visits (MDV) or Instructional hours. Similarly, Culinary Assistants must complete an annual Sanitation Workshop and minimum hours.

Boat operations are more complex, requiring: an annual Operations Workshop, minimum underway hours, annual Team Coordinated Training and passing a Qualification Exam every 3 years. These requirements all have specific purposes, which drive the timing. Some activities, such as Instruction, are spread throughout the year. Many others, especially in northern areas like New York, are primarily summer activities. Thus, it makes sense for most of workshops to be updated during the winter and required to be taken in the spring. Minimum hours, VSCs, MDVs, etc are tracked on an annual basis, thus must be completed by December 31 to avoid temporarily losing your qualifications.

Penn Yan Boats

There's nothing like a boat show to make you realize what you DON'T know. In my case, that's a lot – including answers to simple questions about our "Base" boat, like its length or what year it is!

The "Penn Yan I" (a 1965 I/O) was donated to the flotilla around 2002 and sold in 2018. Our current Base boat (often called the "Penn Yan 2") is a 1996 I/O "Adventurer" model closed runabout. Its length is 20.5', beam 8'. We placed it into service as a facility in 2017.

2021 marked the 100-year anniversary of the original Penn Yan Boat Company. Founded in 1921, it failed in the 1930's, was sold off and succeeded by Penn Yan Boats, Inc. That company was sold to new owners in 1979. The last sale of the company occurred in 1987 and became Penn Yan Marine Manufacturing. It continued under that name until the company was closed for good in 2001. The old boatworks have fallen into ruin, and after remediation will probably be developed into residential properties. Lucky for us, parts are still available from pennyanboats.com.

Penn Yan was always an innovative and well-respected line. Products ranged from canoes, sailboats up to 24', "car-toppers," runabouts, and cabin cruisers over 30'. One of their leading patents was the tunnel drive, which allowed for shallow draft operations and reputedly improved speed and stability.
