
Feature Article – Flotilla 2-2 History (cont) by Arnold Jacob Albrecht (edited by Kim Walsh)

We pick up our story in our bicentennial year—1976. Jim Freeman, a dedicated member, died on January 25th. His parents honored his commitment to Flotilla 2-2 by funding a major renovation of the Base office, which was dedicated to him upon completion in 1977. In further facility news, a new roof covering was put in place in 1976 and new heating system installed in 1977. On the operational side,

Henry Stabel and Arnold Albrecht had the honor of escorting the Bicentennial "Barge" from the Mud Lock on its way to Ithaca. Members Cecil Cage offers

Cayuga Lake excursions on the Tiger Lady and Dick Haviland also has a charter boat license. Flotilla & members earned three plaques in 1976: First in Courtesy Marine Examinations (CMEs); 100% of National Goal, Public Affairs; and Arnold Albrecht – most CMEs.



In **1980**, Base improvements continued with two bays of the garage being remodeled for a Classroom. Chuck Holmes taught 400 kids the "Water 'N Kids' Course at Endwell. I was awarded a Plaque as the "Outstanding Auxiliarist." In **1981**, Russ Mott was the Flotilla Commander. He appointed Henry Stabel as the Historian. We are saddened by the loss of Paul Sandefur and honored him with a memorial by our entryway. Once again, we held a New Year's Party at the Base. Our numbers grew with the addition of the whole Hall family—Joy & Ed plus children, Ed & Cheryl. We were awarded Plaques for both the First & Second place Division Publication and First Place Member Training.

There was a major revision to the Auxiliary Manual, effective Jan 6, **1982**. We began collaborating with the USPS, by allowing them to hold a meeting at the Base. We earned First place Plaques for both Member Training and Public Education. In **1983**, we instituted a couple of Public Education initiatives—Peter De Graff started giving "Old Boater Tricks" in PE classes. Also, station WICB-FM broadcast Flotilla 2-2 Safe Boating hints, provided by John Keshishoglou. We were awarded the First place Plaque for Member Training. We didn't earn any awards in **1984**, but Ed Marmol, DIRAUX attended our meetings. Cora Bangs took over Publications.

We began Boat Crew, Operator and Coxswain Training in **1985**. Once again, we earned the First place Plaque for Member Training. In **1986**, Flotilla had a booth at Pyramid Mall. Also, more boats have VHF Transceivers. L.W. Van Duzer was awarded a Plaque for Member Training. **1987** was a banner year for the Flotilla—we earned First place Plaques for Operations and Flotilla Publication plus Outstanding Flotilla!

We continued strong in **1988**! We taught 28 sailors and 34 power boaters in our PE classes and completed 328 CMEs! We earned a Unit Award for Public Education plus four Plaques: First place, CMEs; First place Operations; 100% National Goal, Member Resources; and Outstanding Flotilla. We celebrated the Auxiliary's 50th Anniversary in **1989**, with many dignitaries visiting our Flotilla. David Maycumber gave fire demonstrations. We were awarded a Unit Award Plaque for Public Education. In **1990**, we earned the First Place Plaque for Operations. For enjoyment, Chuck Holmes arranged a "Touch of Brass" Concert. The Change of Watch (COW) was at the Lehigh House and we went back to the Base after the Dinner. John Pitts was a QE in **1991**. The COW was at the Holiday Inn and 2-2 was awarded a Plaque for Outstanding Flotilla. May 2, **1992** was Flotilla 2-2's 50th Anniversary and we held a big celebration at the Base June 6, 1992.



We hosted New York State Law Enforcement training on May 3, **1993** at the Base. NYS Parks and Recreation used the base classroom and docks for two weeks to conduct basic and advanced marine law enforcement schools. Auxiliarists acted out various illegal/suspicious activities on their facilities to which the law enforcement trainees had to react and figure out what to do. Doug Redfern (coxswain) and Tom Every were potentially drunken boaters. Ron Cooper (coxswain who "couldn't speak English") was "taken into custody" and physically removed off his boat to a police boat where he was frisked and handcuffed while on his knees. A Coast Guard Dolphin helicopter pulled a sheriff's deputy out of the lake as part of a recovery demonstration/exercise. They had stopped at the Cortland airport first so a crew member could briefly visit his family.

While doing a dockside interrogation of Doug and Tom in the base boat, a sheriff's deputy accidently dropped our driver's licenses into Treman State marina at 3:00 on a Friday afternoon. They didn't float. After putting pressure on them, the Park Police called the County Clerk and got her to keep the DMV open late so we could get new driver's licenses around 4:30. She was not amused when we told her how the licenses were lost. But, she felt sorry for us and took care of it. Flotilla 2-2 carried the Olympic Torch across Cayuga Lake. (Editor's note: this is listed in the chronology and vaguely remembered by one of our members, but the timing doesn't quite make sense. If any of our "senior members" have more information, please send it in so we can add more details or correct the records.)

1994 was a big year for Base improvements and fundraisers to pay for them. The lake flood channel bank was built up with rip-rap and a pitched roof was added to the Base building. Administratively, franked mail ended and operationally, we had a search & rescue mission to find two boys lost on the lake. An intoxicated husband and wife started arguing while on their small boat South of Crowbar Point with their 11 yr. old son and a friend. The boys got scared and jumped into the water and started swimming away. The father passed out. The mother, who had little boat experience, panicked and drove the boat all the way back to Ithaca Boating Center where she told Pete DeGraff (Auxiliarist - PE Officer) what happened. He ran to the base and found Coxswain Ron Cooper there. Ron and another crew member jumped in the base boat and went searching for the boys. State Police, Park Police, and Sheriff's Deputies converged on the base to listen to Ron's radio reports. The State Police started a shore search and found the two boys safely at a house on the West shore. Flood channel bank work continued, as did fundraisers in 1995. The Flotilla held a Rendezvous at Taughannock. The National Bridge (Officers) changed in 1995 and Flotilla 2-2 was recognized with a Plaque as Outstanding Flotilla.

In **1996**, Don Rottman erected an entrance shelter on Base and installed mooring cleats on Coast Guard Point. We also had more administrative changes—Division numbers changed from Roman to Arabic and flotillas were advised to eliminate the hyphen in most cases, thus we're now to use "FL 22". Don Rottman continued Base improvements in **1997** by replacing the 2 galley windows with a single unit. Also, the overhead telephone wire across the flood channel was removed, much to the delight of members with sail boats! An individual from Waterloo offered a sailboat to the Flotilla for tax donation purposes; the flotilla accepted the sailboat and sold it as a fundraiser. FL22 participated in the NYS Law Enforcement School held in Ithaca. In member news, Don & Luann Rottman were married and Ann Cooper retired from Agway.

!998 was a rough year on many fronts. Edmund Hurd died on Jan 15th. The March Boating Skills & Seamanship and Sailing & Seamanship classes were small – 14 & 6, respectively. John Pitt had his right toe amputated. The City of Ithaca plan for "The Island" does not include the Auxiliary, which caused much consternation! Inlet Park Marine (Peter De Graff) was purchased by Marina Reality of Ithaca, LLC (Mark Campagnolo, Chris Purdy, Stephen B. Flash), hereafter referred to as "MRI". Their long-term plans included taking over the Auxilliary occupied property for a restaurant. Flotilla 22's NYS leases were still in effect as of Sep 1998. Three huge barges were tied up at the point during the winter. Also, the area of the Point (Marina) was dug up and soil examined for old oil spills.

With our permits still in effect, the city of Ithaca encouraged us to work out an arrangement with MRI in **1999**. MRI sought (and later received) tax breaks and loans from the city, but the restaurant project moved slowly due to money problems. Our Flotilla newsletter was renamed from "2-Scuttle-Butt-2" to "USCG Auxiliary Ithaca" in January. Member Bruce Murray died Sep 6, 1999. In **2000**, Ithaca Marina refused to haul our boats and put them on our property for winter storage, as had been our practice. Those who had their boats on trailers, took them home. The Holmes took theirs to Hibiscus and I took mine to Inlet Marine, MRI. Don Campbell has taken the Flotilla Lead on our property problem with the state and has spent much time on it.

In **2001**, FC Cora Bangs and VFC Don Campbell continued to meet with various people and committees regarding our occupation of the Base. The city "took away" half of the docks, but later returned them. They were put in storage on the east side of the inlet. The "Boatyard Grill" was finished and they continue to relish the idea of getting their hands on the Base for parking. The big news of **2002** was that we remain in the Base!
