

1800 - 2200	Friday Hospitality and Presentation (<i>sign-up required</i>) Come casual and join us for dinner and a presentation by author Rochelle Pennington, whose book <i>Endurance</i> , recants the story of Sir Ernest Shackleton's 1914 expedition to Antarctica. The presentation will detail the extraordinary acts by Shackleton and his men as their ship became trapped in rapidly forming winter ice, 100 miles off the coast of Antarctica. The crew waited for the spring thaw through nine long months of blizzards, gales and temperatures nearing 100 degrees below zero. With food scarce, the men watched in horror as their ship succumbed to the pressure of the frozen ocean, sinking to the bottom of the sea. Their only hope for survival was to travel by foot across hundreds of miles of broken and jagged ice in search of open waters. Nearly two years were spent on ice and ocean, and the journey was recognized as "the greatest survival story of all time."

Workshops

Advanced Registration required for New Member Boot Camp, CPR, First Aid, Coastie

Introduction to Auxiliary Food Specialist

Introduction to this coarse will include the overall requirements needed to become a CERTIFIED Auxiliary Food Specialist according to the USCG & Government food handling and serving specifications. There will be hands on Demonstration of Preparation as well as Official USCG FS1 & FS2 (Gold Side) giving perspective of what the USCG is looking for and how this program helps the overall morale and time off needed by the active duty.

IS Proper Entry

Data Entry students will learn what is and what is NOT acceptable for hours. Based on actual examples.

IS Basic Inputer

How to become an inputer without having to take the IS-10 course.

Proper Wearing of the Uniform ODU/SDB/Trops

Students will learn the proper wearing of the multiple uniforms Auxiliarists are tasked with.

Introduction to AUX AIR:

We would like to invite all members who are interested in becoming pilots and observers to this session. The session will be 1 hour in length. This session WILL NOT count as a safety workshop for the purpose of currency of existing pilots. I would however like you to reserve the pool for anyone who needs the swim test to maintain currency, as well as any new member who has been in training and needs the swim test to complete their qualification. 

WOW Web Sites

WOW (Websites withOut Webmasters) is a data driven website development system provided by the Auxiliary IT group that allows members with no previous web programming experience to easily develop and publish their Division and Flotilla web sites. No knowledge of HTML is required to get rich multi-page, graphic oriented web sites deployed onto the internet. This session will also include a hands-on exercise in which student will develop and publish a WOW2 site. Bring your laptops!

OPS Plan for 2014

This seminar will focus on moving forward from the 2013 Sector Lake Michigan Operational Planning Directive in furthering the goal of reducing water recreation-related deaths in the AOR through a proactive and preventative approach. Efforts 9th Western Auxiliary members can make informing the recreational boating public through classroom education, dockside engagements, vessel safety checks, and public affairs initiatives will be discussed.

Public Education Best Practices

Best practices will be covered for Public education Classes including: Marketing, prep & organization of classes, mentoring flotilla member who desire to become instructors, managing students, addressing kids vs adults. Many more topics.

Public Affairs and Media Relations

Auxiliarists will learn about Coast Guard public affairs policies; media relations and what to do before, during and after an interview; things to be aware of when working with media; and social media do's and don'ts.

Personal PPE Inspection

Students will learn how to inspect their own PPE prior to the semi annual official inspection.

Pool

The Hotel Pool will be available for operations and aviation swim Sign-offs.

MMSI Requirements & DSC Operation

"You purchased this new DSC equipped radio for your facility. Now What?"

Proper Boat Crew Communications

Proper use of pronouns and proper format when communicating with stations and other Coast Guard Assets.

Program Visitor Best Practices

Best practices and "Vessel Safety Pack" deployment.

Intro to Hazard Materials:

Hazardous materials are materials which, because of their chemical, biological or physical nature, pose a potential risk to life, health or property if they are released or misused. These chemicals are used in agriculture, industry, medicine, research and consumer goods. This quick-study course is intended to provide interested members with a basic introduction to hazardous materials that can serve as a foundation for more specific research. No prior knowledge of the subject is assumed.

Vessel Examinations

- **Practical VE training** (1.5 hr) This course will be cover topics for any qualified Vessel Examiner or VE Staff Officer. The course will focus on resources and practical techniques for becoming a more proficient examiner and leading VE Blitzes to engage more of our members in the VE mission.

- 2014 refresher VE Workshop (2 hrs) This course will cover topics for any qualified Vessel Examiner or other members familiar with the VE Manual and having passed the VE Qualification Exam. The course is a supplement for the regular VE Workshops presented in our Divisions and will discuss new items for 2014, addressing RBS trends, and this year's high focus items.

- Advanced Workshop for Vessel Examiners (1.5 hr) This course will cover topics for experienced Vessel Examiners and other Public Educators/Program Visitors interested in of the how and why behind RBS regulations. The course will take a deeper look at common, but infrequent, topics that arise during Vessel Examinations, which are not covered in the VE Manual.

HR Fundamentals

Basic understanding of the HR role, submission of paperwork, where which forms go, proper enrollment processing and ID card submissions. All the other 'little things' that involve the Flotilla HR Officer. The second part of this training will be Fingerprint Tech. All students MUST have completed the online course to take this portion of the training. Please bring your passing certificates with you. Fingerprint cards will be available for applications to be processed as fingerprint technicians.

Operations Advanced Navigational Exercise

Training will cover basic navigation and SAR execution plotting. Participants need to be Crew or Coxswain qualified and bring basic navigation tools.

Boat Crew Mentoring

Mentoring, to support and encourage people in order that they may maximize their potential..." Mentoring is crucial to the boat crew program, but it is also crucial to our new members; this program will identify key components to being a successful mentor.

Recruiting and Diversity

A 1 hour presentation covering recruiting practices and diversity within the Auxiliary.
