#### **CHRISTMAS TREE SHIP**



For the 20th year, the Coast Guard undertook the Chicago Christmas Tree Ship. Cutter Mackinaw loaded 1200 trees at Cheboygan and brought them down to be distributed to deserving families in Chicago. This honors the tradition of the Xmas Tree Ships, and the mariners who have lost their lives on the Lakes. The Rouse Simmons was one of the small schooners that made a last bit of money by cutting trees up north, then bringing them to Chicago and selling them right off the dock. She went down with the loss of all on board while making a tree run in November 1912. The captain/owner of the Simmons is remembered for setting aside a few trees to be given to families who could not afford to buy one. This year, in a break with tradition, the Mackinaw dropped a wreath off the port of Thompsonville, from which the Simmons had set out. 39-02 member Bridget Darrey helped operate Coastie at Navy Pier, to the delight of the kids there. She was helped by Bill Luksha and Jenn Austin, along with Michael Hudec, Terry Paggi and Robert Hennessy. Tim stood watch guiding tours through the ship. Your Editor told school groups about environmental protection and invasive species Friday morning, then also guided tours through the ship. (To children: "Do you go to school? This is our schoolroom.")

The crew of *Mac* were grateful to all the Auxiliarists who assisted them in this event.
