CHICAGO AIR AND WATER SHOW

Our Flotilla had an interesting time during the Air and Water show. New member Ruben Howard came out and helped at the shore side tent, talking up the Auxiliary and water safety. At every opportunity, we mentioned the loss of life on the Great Lakes this year and encouraged rip tide awareness and the importance of wearing lifejackets. Nearby were the

Red Arrow tent, for the Royal Air Force precision flying team. They flew their aerobatic planes over from England, and Chicago was their first stop. Weather socked down the Saturday show early after just a couple of passes by the Blue Angels, and the show was delayed Sunday until after noon. On the water, patrols were run out of station Calumet and Station Wilmette to control the crowds of boaters (especially those who didn't know how to anchor)
