The District 9(WR) Awards process is currently being reviewed and updated to make the process clearer and easier to understand. The types of awards are as follows:

Feature Story!

- **District Awards -** Given to Individuals and Flotillas with the highest ranking in the District based on performance and the Data comes from AuxData (important to get your 7029s in!)
- **Anniversary Certificates/Awards -** Given to Individuals based on the TIME they have been a member of the Auxiliary
- **Qualification Awards (Campaign) -** Given to Individuals based on: Training; Education; or Test completion. In the form of: Ribbon bars, Stars, or other metal attachments
- **Service Awards -** Given to Individuals for achieving a certain quantity of service within a calendar year; the award types are specified in the Auxiliary Manual
- Achievement Awards are well explained in Chapter 11 of the Auxiliary Manual, and are the means by which we recognize our fellow shipmates for their exemplary service in ways that:
 - are exceptional performance of duty, which benefits the Auxiliary
 - have a significant positive effect on the ability of the Coast Guard and/or the Auxiliary to complete its missions and goals
 - recognize outstanding assistance that furthers any of the Auxiliary's authorized activities.
