NEW BUSINESS

- a) Anderson Grant TV monitor to play DVDs at PA booths?? We'd have to pay for electricity each time (Alliant Energy Center wants ~\$100)
 - o Linder reports lean year for Grant; only \$100-200 per unit probably
 - o Statz offered TV monitor and DVD player with batteries for use
 - short discussion on whether or not to use at PA booths; Bidinger pointed out prefer total human contact rather than use of technology; we will continue to consider
 - Linder suggested applying for Grant to make the posters for boat launches and marinas
 - Statz suggested his brother put boating informative page in his mailings throughout the Division for Safe Boating Week; Linder will talk to him
- b) PA Survey
 - o brief comments about communications methods and making them better known
 - o Bidinger will do Member Training for April's Flotilla meeting with a presentation about PA activities and what they can do for the Flotilla. Bidinger is just back from an exciting and rewarding C-school for PA in Alameda, CA.

From potluck meeting 26 Mar, 1800-2000, with water personnel from Dane County Sheriff, WI DNR, State Boating Law Administrator, and Maple Bluff and Middleton Fire/Rescue Units. PowerPoint presentation used to provide information and initiate discussions. Lead by M. Van Dinter.

M. Van Dinter:

Information about:

- RBS Outreach
 - o through various educational resources to reduce deaths and injuries
 - summary of fatality statistics
- introduced Admiral's Great Lakes plans for partnering with local entities
 - o explained Sector Lake Michigan information
 - Operational Planning Direction FY2012
 - increase preventive activities
 - how can we all partner up resulting in doing our jobs better
- Law Enforcement Partners
 - deliver branded messages, via literature
 - encourage frequent boater contacts
 - Emphasize need for look-outs
 - Increase adult life jacket wear
 - Speed control
 - Increase Nav Rule awareness DNR pointed out this was a big issue; difficult to address with short PA spots or literature
 - BUI –targeted outreach
 - Increase media exposure
 - Enhance compliance outreach
 - ID missing items
 - ID those required for safety
 - Support education
 - o Encourage attendance at boating safety classes
- Include tribal authorities can we do this? are they interested? DNR pointed out only one area really that has boating possibilities. Tribes do conduct safe boating classes. SBLA will attempt to make contacts.
- Operation Drywater, June 22-24, 2012 statistics shown; perhaps second joint campaign after Safe Boating Week

J. Van Dinter:

Marine Radios:

- need to encourage use, especially DSC
 - o must make sure boaters know they have to register radio AND hook it up to their GPS units
 - USCGAux uses Ch 83 as working channel; currently on Dane County Sheriff authorized user but will change our operational orders to include Fire Depts who currently use 13 and 67
 - monitor Ch 16 and 83
 - o need to educate boaters to not use Ch 16 as a conversation channel
- we will be making formal arrangements so law enforcement knows when USCGAux is out on the water
- requested law enforcement get VSCs done on their boats as examples to the public

M. Van Dinter:

More visits to launch ramps and docks as well as putting up informational posters at boat launches:

- law enforcement encourages
 - o visiting ramps and docks anytime
 - o they point out need more attention on Nav Rules
 - o they point out need to figure out why boaters are getting into the water
 - o shouldn't be a problem putting posters in state parks just ask the superintendent

Listed many of the various Summer Activities expected this summer around the Sector AOR (fire works displays, Rockets for Schools in Sheboygan, War of 1812 Commemoration in Milwaukee, local events like Ironman, Paddle and Portage, sailing regattas, etc)
Life Jacket Awareness

- literature distributions to Marine Dealers, etc
- support Paddles Up Initiative
- outreach to schools

Reduce swimming fatalities

USCGAux to distribute literature to hotels with water access – in Madison area this is Edgewater Hotel

Kiesel:

RBS Missions:

- more VSCs
 - directive says to increase 15% over 2011
 - o distribute West Marine coupons for safety equipment
- visit marinas and yacht clubs, especially during Safe Boating Week
- Reach the public locally
 - o safe boating classes (DNR certified) –the usual at Skipper Buds and Redline Watersports
 - o safe paddling classes locally 2 new classes this spring; partnering with Gander Mt to hold classes there
 - Fishing Expo, Canoecopia
 - o literature displays at paddling vendors
 - o school visits Cambridge
 - o visits to beaches, hotels, marinas informational posters or brochures, possibly bi-lingual

Moffat:

Local Operational Efforts:

- schedule patrols with local partners for high impact times and activities probably late afternoon and evening, also night
- target small boats, especially boaters who don't consider themselves to be boaters (fishermen, hunters)
- strengthen training requirements and expectations
- meet and greet boaters
- Culver's coupons for kids we find wearing PFDs

Bidinger:

PA partnering:

- suggested teaming up with law enforcement for TV spots and interviews
- coordinate efforts and collectively make a difference
- Safety and Rescue on lakes to educate people
- Get sponsors for Safe Boating Week
 - o have give-aways
 - get representations of all boats (Sheriff, DNR, Fire/Resuce, Dive Team, and USCGAux) at Tenney Locks for TV spot
- DNR wants statewide coverage, not just local
 - o Bidinger suggests starting locally and then expanding statewide with other Divisions
 - demonstrate what can be done successfully here with PA spots; that will get other USCGAux units interested to partner with DNR for statewide coverage
- Bidinger will do the PA work for all local entities interested, just needs to know who in their organizations to contact to find out what they would like

DNR:

Suggests we do VSCs on the first Fishing Day, first Sat in May.

Consensus of this meeting:

- well received by all attendees
- local entities went away understanding the USCGAux and missions much better
- DNR and Dane County Sheriff seemed very interested in working with Bidinger for PA activities
- great food!!
