# Tour of the new Bay Bridge Eastern Span with Caltrans, June 22

It took several months to schedule our tour by Caltrans to get a beautiful close up glimpse of the underside of the new Eastern span from Oakland to Treasure Island. 23 of our Flotilla members went out on the Bay for an hour.

Did you know: the main cable is one continuous and almost a one mile long, 30" thick cable made up of 17,399 individual steel wires; the 525' tower has 4 legs; made up of steel and concrete; there are 452 deck sections on the Skyway alone. The present bridge has approx. 280,000 cars crossing per day and approx 102 million/year? There were so many factoids you will have to visit their website and be astounded at the number of bolts; architects, engineers, welders, inspectors, iron workers, concrete workers, crane operators, foundation workers; several countries around the world



that contributed parts.

There are cormorant bird boxes under the bridge. There is no jump proof rail or net as the height of the bridge does not warrant it. Did you know there is a troll on the North side of the old Eastern span?



If you have driven to our Flotilla meetings on YBI all these past months, you would marvel as you drove under the construction of this magnificent feat of engineering.
