outfit. Today's Life Jackets come in many different styles and shapes.

In the US Coast Guard, nobody goes on a boat without a Life Jacket.

If an accident happens, this Life Jacket will help keep you afloat. In most cases it will keep your head above the water even if unconscious. If the boat is sinking, or on fire, you can jump in the water, and your Life Jacket will keep you afloat. It will keep you from getting exhausted(page 4)
