He held 7 Membership Service Awards, the Operations Program Award, 3 Operations Service Awards, 2 Public Education Service Awards, the Coast Guard Bicentennial Unit Commendation, 2 awards of the Coast Guard Meritorious Team Commendation, the Coast Guard Unit Commendation Award, the DOT Secretary's Outstanding Unit Award, the Presidential Unit Citation and 5 Auxiliary Service Awards.

A native of Seattle, he is survived by his sister. He will be missed.
