The Division is holding its annual Training Session at Chinook Winds in Lincoln City on March 21st and 22nd with the Division business meeting on the 23rd. Training will cover many topics with trainers well versed in their specific topics. Staying on the topic of Training, I must remind everyone that the new AUXLMS course (ctrl+click to follow link) must be completed by all current members. The courses are online are not difficult and do not take a lot of time. All can be completed in a couple of hours or you can do 1 a day. The 8 hour TCT course has been changed. Unless you will participate in direct Coast Guard activities the 8 hour has been changed to a 4 hour class. The 1 hour annual refresher is still required and the 5 year 4 hour class is still required. Jerry Evans will be conducting the 4 hour class in April for all new members and members that are due for their 5 year renewal. Actual date will be posted as soon as it is set. The busy boating season is approaching so take advantage of the slow time and put it to good use by completing all of your requirements.

Surface Operations

Boating Season 2014

Boating Season is fast approaching. We have had very little underway activity since last September. Needless to say our boat crew skills have become somewhat "barnacle" encrusted for lack of use. We have completed some classroom training and will begin underway training this month. The areas most in need of attention are:

Communications Personal Protection Equipment ("Anti-Exposure Suits") Boat Handling Line Handling Rules of the Road Navigation Documentation of Activities



We have two boat crew members and one coxswain who are due for a QE session this year. The 8 hr. TCT has been reduced to 4 hrs. for missions that are not in direct support of the "Gold" side. There are currently five members due for the 4 hr. TCT which is on a 5 year cycle. Last year we conducted 17 Burials at Sea and I anticipate that many or more this year. Currently we have 3 active facilities. One facility is mainly for inland missions and the remaining two are available for off shore missions. We anticipate adding two more facilities.

Our underway missions are one of the most important ways to support the boating public.

We completed a session of 1 Hr. TCT/OPS Workshop with 4 members participating. The current boat crew currency requirements are primarily 12 hours underway and QE's every 3 years after initial qualification. Full participation by qualified crew members in underway missions will make these requirements easy to meet. Boat crew members should make an effort to review appropriate manuals and procedures prior to the class room sessions and underway pre-briefs in order to fully participate in the discussions. If you don't know the questions you can't get the answers. Knowledge is power.

Remember the 7 Ps.
