There was a strong sense of support, gratitude and pride among Flotilla 63 Members. We all were eager in anticipation of Dennis' leadership and his already clear vision for "Sweetness in 2013," to be a guiding principle for the Division. In attendance were Bob and Cammy Hickman, Ray and Kay Neubig, Suzy Nelson, and Mike Johnson and Anya Doll.

Representatives from Flotillas around Division 6, including from the newly formed Flotilla 67 in Bend, and members from the U.S. Coast Guard all arrived to enjoy a social hour before the splendid lunch was served. The Change of Watch Program itself started with pomp and remembrance. Bob Hickman delivered the Invocation and then all observed the Eight Bell Ceremony with Cammy Hickman reading Tennyson's "Crossing the Bar," and Mel Chaput ringing the bell as we recalled, "Our shipmates have stood the good watch and have earned a well-deserved rest."

Very much in character with Dennis' style, the program moved quickly to business and we Auxiliarist of the Year observed awards. Congratulations to Cammy Hickman for receiving Flotilla 63's Auxiliarist of the Year! (In an aside, we learned she'd earned the honor of Master Gardener of the Year as well for Tillamook County!) A Well-deserved honor for outstanding commitment and hard work! Before we moved on, there was a special award given also to Kay Neubig, the out-going Division 6 Vice-Commander for which she also won a standing ovation from those gathered. Congratulations and thank you Kay!

Outgoing Division Officers were honored and incoming Officers took their oath of office. Most notable was that Ray Neubig is leaving his position in Operations after eight years of service in that position. For 2013, Division 6 Officers include: Cammy Hickman, Finance; Bob Hickman, Member

Training; John Lister, Programs and Vessel Examinations; Anya Doll, Publications; Richard Aton, Human Resources; Emily Chaput, Public Affairs; and Dale Jacobs, Operations.

Before the Program speakers, we had one last ovation to bestow and this was upon Jerry Pritchard for earning the Fred Milgrand Award for Vessel Exams. In 2012, Jerry completed 106 VEs, in 2011 it was 110. The two previous years he'd completed 140 and 147 VEs respectively. Quite an achievement!

Speakers at the event had a hard act to follow in Commander Bill Gibbons, who attended the event with his son, Commander Gibbons has been Chief Responder for Columbia River since August 2012. In 2002 he managed the Surf Program in Oregon and having fallen in love with the region, he requested this location again for duty. A 20 year veteran, Commander Gibbons was stationed in New York City for 9/11; in 2005 he was stationed in Louisiana during Hurricane Katrina; and was in Washington D.C. during the sniper attack. So when someone in the audience cut the heavy tension that accompanies such a resume' with "when are you leaving?" it became clear that Chief Gibbon's sense of humor as much as his ability to command has been a tremendous asset. He asserted that his first lesson in leadership came from Kenneth Blanchard who's book inspires one toward "Servant Leadership." Inspired by this, the Commander relayed an understanding leadership that focus' on the people, investing in them, then on the Mission. He relayed examples of how honoring those under one's command has time and again led him to deeper respect when those individuals rose to the missions at hand. He concluded by adding that he has seen the Auxiliary "embody such a culture of respect,... I love hanging out with you!"

Commander Gibbons then introduced Flotilla Members to the Auxiliary Liaison for Sector Columbia River, Lt., Sara Pulliam who was told by the Chief that she didn't need to come, yet drove all the way down to Lincoln City to meet with us.

We heard also from Commodore Peter Raiswell, Division 5 Captain Brad Schuldt and Division 7 Commander Ken Babick. In closing, Commodore Raiswell's point was well taken, that "when you move up, you move away from the individual work, so you need to surround yourself with good people." Positions of leadership are, to his point, primarily to support individuals and Flotillas in doing the work in the field. Without this, "the job is meaningless." Commodore Raiswell is this year moving on to the National Office for Incident Management. Congratulations! And welcome to District 13's new Commodore, Dean Wimer.
