Welcome to the Northwest District Navigation Systems Division Aids Verifier Program

The Prevention Department, Navigation Systems Division program encourages the checking of every Federal Aid to Navigation and Bridge by any Auxiliarist at any time. Member are encouraged to check an Aid or Bridge and report any observed discrepancies to the Coast Guard. "Qualified Auxiliarists and their facilities are authorized assignment to duty to support and augment the Coast Guard's navigation systems (NS) program. This includes verifying position and characteristics of private aids-to-navigation (PATON), after qualifying as an aid verifier (AV). Auxiliarists may assist and support aids-to-navigation (ATON) units... Auxiliarists may also help NOAA and the US Army Corps of Engineers (USACOE) in updating nautical and aeronautical charts and publications. ... Qualified Auxiliarists and their facilities are authorized assignment to duty to support and augment bridge surveys, investigate and provide information regarding waterways safety and navigation situations pertaining to the bridge program, ..." (Excerpted from Chapter 2, Sections B.4 & B.5, "Programs/Activities Authorized for Auxiliarists" of the Auxiliary Manual.)

- 1. The approach of the Aids Verifier program is on accuracy, credibility, professionalism and service to the Coast Guard, and is builds the competency level and professionalism of the Auxiliary members in the eyes of Coast Guard. Guidelines are provided for taking fixes and depths accurately, including pre-underway and on-scene validation of measuring equipment, credible quality on-scene observations and measurements, and professional report preparation. This activity is accomplished via fixes taken with WAAS-GPS (or cell phone app if acceptable), depths corrected to the charted vertical datum, physical measurements, photographs and drawings and the validation of all observations to the Light List, the Coast Pilot and on the NOAA Nautical Chart/s. It can by no means be achieved by a cursory glance.

The Light List contains detailed information for all the Federal Aids, the Class I and II Private Aids, and the lighted Bridges in your AOR. It is updated daily, online. Recently reorganized to an alphabetical listing by Waterway name plus a map-based reports.

Download for pre-mission planning. Provides updates on P/ATONs, bridges (esp. discrepancies), nautical charts, maritime activities, etc. Recently reorganized to an alphabetical listing by Waterway name.

Generally, you need access to an OPFAC to participate in the NS program. New members are encouraged to join their Auxiliary Navigation Systems Team.
