Congratulations on joining the Auxiliary Forces of the US Coast Guard! You may be wondering "Am I part of the Coast Guard"? Yes, you certainly are. The Coast Guard is made up of four interconnected forces; active duty, reserves, civilians and auxiliary. Each has a different work and pay schedule. Our particular branch has very flexible hours and as such has no pay. However, we are a part of the organization and therefor have training items we must complete just as any other member of the Coast Guard does. So where do you start?

First, you will want to have a copy of the Auxiliary Manual. That can be located at www.uscg.mil/auxiliary/publications/auxman.pdf. I would recommend downloading it and not printing it as it is 9.5MB and 795 pages long.

Once you receive your member number from the Director of Auxiliary (DIRAUX) you will be able to log onto the Auxiliary Learning Management System (AUX LMS) and complete the eight mandatory training modules we all need to do. AUX LMS is located here: https://auxlearning.uscg.mil


Click on the "Agree" button and it will lead you to this page;

Each of these courses will automatically upload into your training record when you complete them so there is no need to provide those to your Flotilla Commander. 
