Coast Guard Towing Policy

The Coast Guard will only tow a vessel if it is deemed to be in danger. If the vessel is not in danger, the Coast Guard will not tow it.

The guidelines the Coast Guard uses are:

- 1. Be at least two nautical miles from shore
- 2. Be unable to propel itself under its own power
- 3. Be in danger of sinking, capsizing, or grounding
- 4. Pose a threat to navigation

If you do not meet these requirements, like running out of fuel on a calm day, your option is to engage a towing outfit like SeaTow https://seatow.com/ or TowBoat US (Boat US), https://boatus.com/. Both offer various forms of membership. You can still call them if not a member, but the price will be higher.
