

Marine Toilet Pump Out Stations

Federal law, [https://www.epa.gov/sites/default/files/2021-06/documents/a\\_recreational\\_boaters\\_guide\\_to\\_vessel\\_sewage.pdf](https://www.epa.gov/sites/default/files/2021-06/documents/a_recreational_boaters_guide_to_vessel_sewage.pdf), prohibits the discharge of untreated sewage into U.S. waters, including all inland waters, the Great Lakes, and coastal waters extending to three miles from shore. The discharge of any treated or untreated sewage is prohibited in freshwater lakes, ponds, reservoirs, and rivers unnavigable by interstate vessel traffic.

There are no discharge zones where treated waste disposal is prohibited. Go to this article to see the no discharge zones in the Northeast:
