## Protection of Military Vessels

Per 33 CFR Part 165 Subpart G, <a href="https://www.ecfr.gov/current/title-33/chapter-l/subchapter-P/part-165/subpart-G">https://www.ecfr.gov/current/title-33/chapter-l/subchapter-P/part-165/subpart-G</a>, when within a naval vessel protection zone, a 500-yard regulated area of water surrounding large U.S. naval vessels that is necessary to provide for the safety or security of these U.S. naval vessels. You shall operate at the minimum speed necessary to maintain a safe course, unless required to maintain speed by the Navigation Rules, and shall proceed as directed by the Coast Guard, the senior naval officer present in command, or the official patrol.

When within a naval vessel protection zone, no vessel or person is allowed within 100 yards of a large U.S. naval vessel unless authorized by the Coast Guard, the senior naval officer present in command, or official patrol.

To request authorization to operate within 100 yards of a large U.S. naval vessel, contact the Coast Guard, the senior naval officer present in command, or the official patrol on VHF-FM channel 16
