NEW Basic Qualification Program - IMPORTANT

Below are key excerpts from a recently released note from the Deputy Director National Training Directorate and Deputy Director Human Resources Directorate concerning a NEW BQ Course Qualification Beta Program:

- The new Basic Qualification Course has been released to 3 districts as Beta Sites for a 6 month trial period. In those districts, the BQ Course will be used as a voluntary participation path from AP to BQ. Included in the PQS are signoffs for other training material including: ICS 100, ICS 700, Mandated Training, and a NASBLA certified boating training course, ADM Papp's leadership videos, and the completion of an IDP (individual development plan). In addition, the member must have a completed PSI (IQ status).
- The BQ Course is voluntary in all cases. This avoids having different requirements across all the CGAUX districts to become BQ. That said, it is the clear intent that in the Beta Districts (1S, 9E, 11S) the BQ Course be used to move people from AP to BQ status. At this point we hope that the advantage of learning the material in the BQ Course is motivation enough for members to choose the BQ Course path from

AP to BQ status. Feedback from course participants and mentors will be valuable in determining any next steps in motivation.

- Training: The BQ Course Student Study Guide covers all the questions in the PQS. Additional information is available from the Auxiliary Manual if more detail is desired. While a one on one relationship with a mentor is an ideal way to learn the material, self-study is definitely possible (as with AUXOP courses) but a classroom environment may be ideal for reviewing the material. Regardless of the method of study however, it will be necessary to have one or more mentors sign off the PQS indicating the member knows or knows where to find the answers. No mentor should sign off the PQS based only on attendance at a training session.
- PQS Signoff & registration: The BQ Course PQS needs mentors to sign off each question in a manner similar to the boat crew PQS. More than one mentor can be involved with signoffs. The final mentor will fill out a form indicating completion of the PQS, including all the other course requirements (mentioned above). He will then make a copy available to the member with the original being sent to the FC for endorsement. The FC will then send the form to DIRAUX to effect the AUXDATA entry and change of status to BQ. The member keeps the signed off PQS (as with boat crew).
- Mentors: As in the case with NTC proctors, the goal with mentors is to appoint members of high standing who will ensure the proper signoffs are accomplished based on demonstrated knowledge by the member. The FC is responsible for selecting mentors in their flotilla. Guidelines might include previously or currently elected officials, people with some experience with PQSs e.g. coxswains, and members who are BQ/AX and have ideally already completed all the other courses required (see above). Ultimately it is the FC responsibility to select the mentors.
- Classroom Training: If you consider other PQS certifications e.g.
 Boat Crew, Coxswain, AUXMEES, having classes to cover the material

with members is a popular way to keep members moving through the program. There are no Power Points for the BQ Course at this time, so any class would be in the form of a facilitator lead discussion of the material in the SSG. This discussion should lead to the correct answers to the PQS questions. The facilitator has the Mentor Guide as a reference including where to find the information for each PQS question. Reminder: members PQSs can't be signed off because of attendance in a class. Mentors must review each question individually with the member to get a signoff.

 Facilitators: These instructors should be experienced Auxiliarists with a BQ or AX status and IT certification who are familiar with most of the material in the BQ Course. They should be selected by the FC possibly working with the Division Commander to identify the best candidates. Ultimately it is the FC who selects the facilitator unless the classes are held at the division level where the DCDR would make the selection.

- As you can see, this represent quite an overhaul to the current procedure of advancing members from AP to BQ status:
 - Includes a considerable amount of up front training
 - · Appointment of Mentors and Facilitators
 - Formal Mentor PQS sign-offs
 - Facilitator lead training
 - Student Study Guides
 - Etc...
- The process is quite thorough and will require significant management attention. I encourage each FC to give very, very careful thought to this matter.
- I will forward additional documentation, back up, and link to videos within 24-72 hours of this meeting.

NEW Basic Qualification Program - IMPORTANT

Below are key excerpts from a recently released note from the Deputy Director National Training Directorate and Deputy Director Human Resources Directorate concerning a NEW BQ Course Qualification Beta Program:

• The new Basic Qualification Course has been released to 3 districts as Beta Sites for a 6 month trial period. In those districts, the BQ Course will be used as a voluntary participation path from AP to BQ. Included in the PQS are signoffs for other training material including: ICS 100, ICS 700, Mandated Training, and a NASBLA certified boating training course, ADM Papp's leadership videos, and the completion of an IDP

- (individual development plan). In addition, the member must have a completed PSI (IQ status).
- The BQ Course is voluntary in all cases. This avoids having different requirements across all the CGAUX districts to become BQ. That said, it is the clear intent that in the Beta Districts (1S, 9E, 11S) the BQ Course be used to move people from AP to BQ status. At this point we hope that the advantage of learning the material in the BQ Course is motivation enough for members to choose the BQ Course path from AP to BQ status. Feedback from course participants and mentors will be valuable in determining any next steps in motivation.
- Training: The BQ Course Student Study Guide covers all the questions in the PQS. Additional information is available from the Auxiliary Manual if more detail is desired. While a one on one relationship with a mentor is an ideal way to learn the material, self-study is definitely possible (as with AUXOP courses) but a classroom environment may be ideal for reviewing the material. Regardless of the method of study however, it will be necessary to have one or more mentors sign off the PQS indicating the member knows or knows where to find the answers. No mentor should sign off the PQS based only on attendance at a training session.
- PQS Signoff & registration: The BQ Course PQS needs mentors to sign off each question in a manner similar to the boat crew PQS. More than one mentor can be involved with signoffs. The final mentor will fill out a form indicating completion of the PQS, including all the other course requirements (mentioned above). He will then make a copy available to the member with the original being sent to the FC for endorsement. The FC will then send the form to DIRAUX to effect the AUXDATA entry and change of status to BQ. The member keeps the signed off PQS (as with boat crew).
- **Mentors:** As in the case with NTC proctors, the goal with mentors is to appoint members of high standing who will ensure the proper signoffs are accomplished based on demonstrated knowledge by the member. The FC is responsible for selecting mentors in their flotilla. Guidelines might include previously or currently elected officials, people with some experience with PQSs e.g. coxswains, and members

who are BQ/AX and have ideally already completed all the other courses required (see above). Ultimately it is the FC responsibility to select the mentors.

- Classroom Training: If you consider other PQS certifications e.g. Boat Crew, Coxswain, AUXMEES, having classes to cover the material with members is a popular way to keep members moving through the program. There are no Power Points for the BQ Course at this time, so any class would be in the form of a facilitator lead discussion of the material in the SSG. This discussion should lead to the correct answers to the PQS questions. The facilitator has the Mentor Guide as a reference including where to find the information for each PQS question. Reminder: members PQSs can't be signed off because of attendance in a class. Mentors must review each question individually with the member to get a signoff.
- **Facilitators:** These instructors should be experienced Auxiliarists with a BQ or AX status and IT certification who are familiar with most of the material in the BQ Course. They should be selected by the FC possibly working with the Division Commander to identify the best candidates. Ultimately it is the FC who selects the facilitator unless the classes are held at the division level where the DCDR would make the selection.

- As you can see, this represent quite an overhaul to the current procedure of advancing members from AP to BQ status:
 - Includes a considerable amount of up front training
 - Appointment of Mentors and Facilitators
 - Formal Mentor PQS sign-offs
 - Facilitator lead training
 - Student Study Guides
 - Etc..

- The process is quite thorough and will require significant management attention. I encourage each FC to give very, very careful thought to this matter.
- I will forward additional documentation, back up, and link to videos within 24-72 hours of this meeting.

Halt Boat Burglary By William C. Winslow Ever had anything stolen from your boat? This article is for you. Never had anything stolen from your boat? This article is for you.

In my book, the secret to good marine security is to think like a crook and then do the opposite.

Here's what I imagine a criminal might say in certain circumstances: "Boy, look at that! I can see fancy binoculars hanging on a hook and portable electronics through the cabin window — what an easy pluck. This marina is dead at night. No lights, no people, no locked gates to the dock, and this boat is far away from anybody else." Rubbing his hands together, he'll add, "This is like taking candy from a baby."

The light-fingered set is opportunistic, and this scenario is nearly perfect for grabbing the goods and disappearing within a minute or two. So, make it tough for burglars to operate. The easiest items to steal are electronics and gear in open view that are small enough to be quickly stashed in a tote bag. If you own an open runabout, make it your habit to remove all valuables every night. If you have a cabin, don't leave anything in view — draw your curtains over windows and portholes and stash the small but expensive stuff out of sight in drawers and lockers.

Whether you remove portable equipment or not, take the time to engrave your name, home port, driver's license number, state registration number, and hull pin on your VHF radio, GPS handheld, chart plotter, binoculars, and other valuables.

Batten down the hatches before you leave the boat. Fasten companionways with strong locks attached to hasps. Cockpit lockers should also be secured, particularly if they contain items like batteries and expensive life jackets. A burglar will pass your boat by for an easier mark if he has to spend time breaking or picking a lock. Many captains hide an extra set of keys onboard. Don't. Lawbreakers know all the hiding places.

Ideally, keep your boat in a well-lit, secured anchorage with locked doors to docks, cameras, and personnel on site 24/7. If security and cameras aren't present, or you're out on a mooring, install an alarm — even the simplest of set-ups will scare most crooks away (provided there are people about who'll hear the alarm).

Every boater should be observant of strangers seemingly lurking around their home marina or boatyard, particularly those in non-nautical dress (street shoes are often a giveaway). Let a dockhand or the yard manager know if you suspect someone's potentially up to no good. If you're selling your boat, don't hang a *For Sale* sign on it. It affords nefarious characters the cover to snoop and return when no one's about.

What do you do if you have been hit anyway? Report the burglary to the police immediately. Savvy officers in marine units may know where to look for sales of stolen goods, especially if you provide them with a list of all equipment by make, model, and

serial number. Let them know all about the engraving on the stolen items as that will help to prove any recovered goods are yours.

I've been talking about boat burglaries, but entire boats and other watercraft disappear. The most likely vessels to be nicked are boats under 26 feet in length and jet skis. Owners must be diligent in immobilizing their crafts. Again, assess your setup like a thief would and then do all you can to make removal difficult or impossible.

Want a novel way to decrease the likelihood of a dinghy or inflatable being stolen? A veteran Caribbean sailor I know advises boaters to paint these items a weird color — a pink dink will make a crook rethink!

Safeguard Trailered Boats and Personal Watercraft

- Remove all portable equipment and gear and store separately.
- Detach the license plate from the trailer.
- Permanently mark or engrave PWC, boat, trailer, and non-removable equipment and electronics with identifying information.
- Store in a backyard with a locked gate; if the trailer and vessel must remain in front, park in the driveway and position another vehicle in front.
- Face trailer hitch away from the street.
- Remove one trailer wheel and the tongue/hitch.
- Securely chain and lock the boat/PWC and trailer to a tree or secured fence post.
- Install a bright motion-detecting light that focuses on the boat/PWC.
- Connect an alarm system that sounds throughout the neighborhood and alerts you via cellphone.
