Communications Received from District:

- Please let all members know that this meeting is open to all. DCDR Mooney opened by stating that in all his years in the Auxiliary, he has not met a Commodore who is more engaged in all aspects of the auxiliary than our current Commodore Stone. He reviews all Mission Request Forms and knows the involvement of all of the members. He is very supportive. Division 5 is doing very well. Division 10 is the usual leader in member activities but this year, we are within striking distance of overtaking the number 1 position. We are behind in PVs by only 7 and VE by 150. New member training is a high priority.
- The Commodore reviewed each flotilla in the Division and believes that the leadership is going to make the difference. DCDR Mooney also has reviewed performance measures and shares this information with the Flotilla Commanders; sending out emails at least twice a week that contain performance reports which can form the basis of correcting the shortfalls.
- Commodore Stone is concerned with one flotilla that has more members in AP status than BO status. This deserves immediate attention. Another flotilla has not met since Jan 2020. He has met with all levels of leadership, stressing leader accountability and leading by example.
- Recording hours is the key to documenting members' performance. Members are doing work but • not taking/getting credit for their work because they are not recording their hours.
- Workshops must be completed by June 30 to maintain certification as instructor and Vessel ٠ Examiner.
- PPE will be issued to those who have the certification to conduct these activities
- D Train Survey was designed to hear from the membership what their interests and needs are. They want to make it productive and hope to issue certifications in certain areas by the end of the 4 days. They are seeking involvement from new instructors for this D Train; please encourage qualified and interested members to step up.
- Saturday is the District meeting at SUNY Maritime. It is an in-person meeting with the capability for members to participate virtually. A 7101 is required to attend as it is for any in person activity. Anyone interested in getting their portrait done can do so. The uniform is Service Dress Blue for the portrait.

PPE

As of 30 APR, PPE is now being made available for VE and AV. Issued PPE for VE and AV contains the Auxiliary lifejacket, whistle and mirror. These must be inspected by the flotilla safety officer and documented to be certified for use. Per COMO Stone, it is the members responsibility to request PPE issuance through their chain of leadership. To be issued PPE, a VE or AV must be current, otherwise they may be loaned a kit by the flotilla safety officer.

- To support increased demand due to VE, SO-OP ordered (and received) additional PPE. (DD1149 is attached).
- A boat crew PPE kit, & PFD were issued to 05-03 as a ready-service for Bill Jefferson's facility.
- Three whistles and mirrors were issued to 05-04 for VEs
- 05-10 and 05-03 have submitted Appendix G showing crew with inspected PPE.

SURFACE OPERATIONS

- Surface patrols are now approved in SECNY.
- Coxswain Wilkins received approved patrol orders for June 26 PATCOM mission on Bill Jefferson's facility.
- The Surface Operations workshop is mandatory in 2021 for all coxswains, boat crew, personal watercraft operators (PWO), paddle craft operators, and associated trainees. This workshop must be completed by June 30, 2021. If not completed by that date, program participants shall be regarded as

not current in their competency, shall not be authorized to be assigned to duty to perform those program activities, and shall be placed in Required Workshop Not Met (REWK) status.

AIR OPERATIONS

• The Air Operations workshop is mandatory in 2021 for all AUXAIR team members. This workshop must be completed by June 30, 2021. If not completed by that date, program participants shall be regarded as not current in their competency, shall not be authorized to be assigned to duty to perform those program activities, and shall be placed in Required Workshop Not Met (REWK) status.

COVID

- COVID-19 High-Risk Assessment Form ANSC-7101 requirements are still in effect. The form may be accessed <u>here</u>. If you have already completed it, it is not necessary to complete it again.
- Boat Crew Shoreside Training, along with many other missions still requires the submission of a Mission Request form prior to the event.

Just a reminder the new AUXCA (Culinary Assistant) Deployment Guidelines and Procedures are posted on the <u>District 1SR website</u>.

The new AUXCA Specialist SOP has not yet been finalized so mandatory requirements remain as follows:

- Must complete Intro to Risk Management
- 2021 Sanitation Test must be completed by NO LATER than June 30th
- Must complete ICS 100/700
- 12 Hours minimum is not presently known if this requirement will be waived since many USCG Stations, Cutters etc have not yet opened.
- A new AUXCA Logo was presented as well as a proposed device to be worn on our uniforms. This device is awaiting approval.
