SUBJ: Report from SO-CM

- 1. Cape Fear Radio was net control for the Division 10 VHF net radio drill on April 21<sup>st</sup>. As Pelican Radio was excused as was Seahaven there were only check-ins. FSO-CM for 10-06 HHFranke participated in 2 HF radio nets i.e. for the Division 5 and the East Coast. The Auxiliary Monitoring station 34 hours of monitoring for a year to date total of 193 hours.
- 2. Cape Fear Radio was net control for the Division 10 VHF net drill on May 19<sup>th</sup>. Atmospheric conditions were not favorable as the Southwest Sector could not hear net control with the exception of Southport Radio who stated reception was barely readable. Northeast Sector could not be heard.
  - The FSO-CM again participated in two HF radio nets for Division 5 and the East Coast. The net control station transmitted a digital message that was copied solid. As an Aux Mon station another 33 hours of monitoring were reported.
- 3. The SO-CM participated in a PA event at the "Ride the Tide" affair at Blue Water Point Marina on May 7 and another during NSBW at the Marine Mart event on Long Beach Rd. Also reported 49 Marine dealer visits since the April Division Meeting.
