

2016 Div. 10 Year End Public Education Report

All the Flotilla's in Div. 10 have completed their classes for 2016 (10-06 was holding their last class on Oct. 15). We have had a very productive year and all Instructors and particularly our SOPE's should be congratulated.

When we started 2016 our goals were –

- Increase the number of classes offered in Div. 10
- Make sure each Flotilla had a sufficient number of instructors to complete their mission.
- Expand the number of strategic partnerships used in the Division to reach the boating public.

The Div. 10 classes taught this year are as follows -

10-01

- 12 ABS classes 90 students
- 1 Paddlesports 1 student

10-05

- 6 ABS classes 83 students
- 1 BS&S 16 students
- 1 Paddlesports 16 students
- 9 Water n Kids 940 students

10-06

- 5 ABS 43 students
- 1 BS&S 6 students

2016 Div. totals –

- ABS 23 classes 216 students
- BS&S 2 classes 22 students
- Paddlesports 2 Classes 17 students
- Water n Kids 9 classes 940 students

2015 Div. totals-

- ABS 10 classes 120 students
- BS&S 1 class 14 students
- Paddlesports 1 class 4 students
- Water n kids 3 classes 580 students

In 2016 Div. 10 more than doubled the number of adult classes and the number of students taught while significantly increasing the youth classes and students taught.

All Flotilla's reported getting several instructors out of REYR during the year and report that they have an adequate number of qualified instructors to complete their mission.

As respects strategic partnerships –

10-01 – Has taught classes at 10 different locations in 2016 including four marinas, two yacht clubs, two town rec. centers, a Community College and a retail marine equipment supplier.

10-05 has taught a well-attended "Women's only" class with an additional one scheduled for early 2017. They have also taught at two town rec centers and continue to partner with the Brunswick County school system to offer youth classes at the local elementary schools.

10-06 has discussed classes for the public as well as employees at the NC Aquarium at Ft. Fisher.
