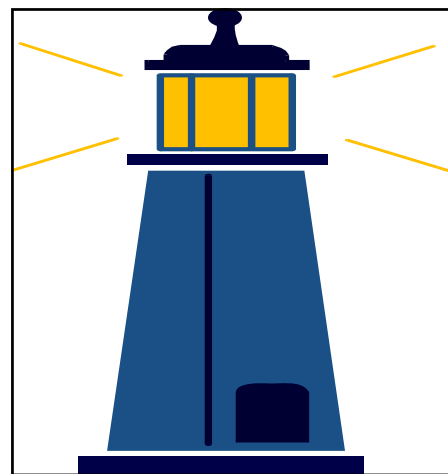

## U. S. COAST GUARD MEETING CHINCOTEAGUE DETACHMENT

A meeting of the U.S. Coast Guard Auxiliary, Chincoteague Detachment, was held at the U.S. Coast Guard Station, Chincoteague, VA on May 21, 2025. The meeting was called to order at 10:03 am and pledge of allegiance recited.

**ATTENDEES:** BM1 Ben Meyer, Mark Wrightstone, Bo Husler, Bill Roche, Luann Roche, Warren Peake and George Dimond.

**BOAT CREW ACADEMY:** A brief update of the ongoing Boat Crew Academy was given. Warren Peake has had his boat examined and approved as a facility vessel.

"On the water" training scheduled for Memorial Day weekend.

**VESSEL SAFETY CHECK EXAMINATIONS:** Vessel Safety Examinations are scheduled for May 24, 2025, at Captains Cove Marina. Mark has planned to have six Vessel Examiners available to prevent the backlog that was experienced last year. We will have a "check in" area to facilitate those coming by vehicle and another for those coming by water.

**PONY PENNING:** BM1 Ben Meyer informed us that because of the terrorist threat to the pony swim, the annual "Open House" at the Chincoteague Station has been officially cancelled. It will be rescheduled later. Warren Peake has agreed to be the lead liaison between the Coast Guard and the Auxiliary for the Pony Penning planning. He will attend all planning meetings and report the planned activities to Auxiliary Command. He has also agreed to offer his vessel for security purposes during the swim. The Coast Guard has requested that we provide two vessels to support CG operations on the day of the pony swim.

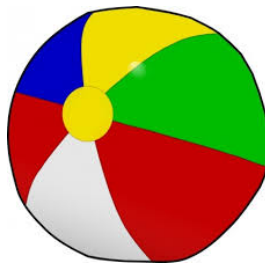
### GLENN DUFFY FSO-HR

On the issue of PPE more specifically, PLB. There have been two instances last month of accidentally sending a distress signal instead of a test signal.

In the first signal was quickly determined to be an accident and no further USCG action need. In the second incident, the signal cause Ocean City N.J. to start a SAR case. Ocean City, MD was able to determine it was not a

SAR case and closed the issue promptly. If you should accidentally send a distress signal, Immediately call the station so that they will not cause a SAR case to be opened.
