On 12 August, Flotilla 20-06 supplied support to a marine event (Shred the Gnar—a wakeboard contest) in Bath Creek from 0930 to 1315. Although the weather cooperated, Don Lindberg's facility, *Turncoat 3*, developed propulsion problems on its way to Bath and had to return to her slip. Andy Anderson then received oral orders from Station Hobucken and with his facility, *Hi Priority*, and Don Lindberg and Dale Benson as crew, completed the mission. The event was well-managed with PWCs to recover downed wakeboarders and no time wasted between trials. With divisions from novice to pro, the wakeboarding talents of the competitors were astounding.

Flotilla Elections

Our flotilla elections are held in November. Members wishing to run for elected office must file a letter of intent no later than September and be vetted by the election committee. All terms are for one year. The FC may serve two consecutive terms. The VFC does not have that restriction.

As a general rule, the first job of any elected or appointed officer is to begin training a replacement. A flotilla has major problems if a long-standing FSO retires or gives up the position suddenly with no one competent to fill that position. Consider which positions you are most interested in, and if you are not currently an elected or appointed officer, work with the current officer to learn the duties of that position so that you may fill that slot when it becomes vacant.
