Need help in encouraging all new members to get their PV Certification which is one of the quickest to attain and will help our numbers in the future.

Paddle Craft initiatives are at the forefront of our effort utilizing the newly available Paddle Craft Materials.

Partner Visits 2019 Goals:

Increase the number of certified PVs in the Division by at least 5.

Continuing work to encourage our new members in the Division to get their PV Certification. Working towards gaining a net of 5 or more in 2019.

Increase the number of visits in 2019 above 2018 level of 1,210.

With some significant known under reporting in AuxData we are currently trending +2% above 2018 Partner Visits through June 2019. We expect to exceed the 2018 number of visits by year's end as there was a significant fall off of activity in the Fall last year due to Hurricane Florence. Fingers crossed on no repeat of that.

As of 22Jul, Auxinfo shows 843 total VEs completed. 440 of those are paddlecraft. Of course, this data always lags because of the need to get the 7038s in. The quicker we get the forms to the FSO-IS, the more up to date the info will be.

I would assume that the three remaining members VEs who have not completed the Intro to RM course do not plan to continue as a VE. Any inspections completed by any of them will not be counted toward individual, flotilla or division statistics.

For those previously certified VEs (3) who went REYR for failing to complete Intro to RM, they would need to complete the class and have it entered in AUXDATA. This does not happen automatically, after completion, print out the report showing completion of the course and get it to the FSO-IS to be entered into the members record. Once it appears in AUXDATA, the FC will need to send a recertification request to DIRAUX that the member has completed the course.

For those that were REYR prior to 7/25, they will still need to do their supervised VSCs and have the Intro to RM course documented as completed.
