
D5SR Policy Manual, Chapter 11, Marine Safety and Environmental Protection:

11.A.1.a. As a Coast Guard team member, every Auxiliarist is responsible for conducting activities with due consideration given to safety and environmental protection. The integration of Prevention Program principles into all relevant Auxiliary activities will be coordinated at each organizational level by the unit's senior elected officer and the Marine Safety Staff Officers.

RECOMMENDATIONS:

- Visit <u>cgaux.org</u> web site, then click on Directorates, then click on <u>Prevention</u>: Now review all MS related materials.
- 2. Get to know your MS Chain of Leadership: Use AUXDIRECTORY to locate MS officers.
- 3. Register for and attend online monthly MS Forums via Zoom.
- 4. Marine Safety Courses are designed to provide a baseline level of training for those interested in the Marine Safety program.
- 5. The Good Mate MS Course is an Ocean Conservancy course and is designed to encourage ocean and waterway conservation by boaters. The course material is available on the Ocean Conservancy website (linked through the AUX Prevention Directorate website by clicking on the MS Courses and then the Good Mate links). The exam is available on the National Testing Center.
- 6. Participate in Marine Safety Outreach Programs (See <u>Outreach Programs link</u> on the Prevention Directorate website), then participate or organize your unit to engage in these programs.
- 7. The Introduction to Marine Safety & Environmental Protection (IMSEP) MS Course is designed to provide an extensive background in the history, policies, laws and regulations pertaining to the Marine Safety and Environmental Protection missions. The course is available on the Department's website. The exam is available on the National Testing Center. PLEASE NOTE THAT THIS COURSE ALSO COUNTS AS TWO POINTS TOWARD THE AUXOP DEVICE.
- 8. Take the AUX-MSAM and/or the AUX-MEES PQSs (Study Guides and Workbooks are found on the Prevention Directorate website under the MS PQS link. You must find a qualified Mentor to sign you off on the tasks. Use AUXDIECTORY to find a nearby Auxiliarist having the qualification.
- 9. Achieve the Marine Safety Training Ribbon: The application for the <u>MSTR</u> may be found within the online Prevention Directorate under the Members Only link.
- 10. The are some 24 MS PQSs we can participate in, but only if your CG Sector needs help in any of these areas.
- 11. Achieve the <u>Marine Safety Insignia Device</u> i.e. "Trident Device". The application for the Marine Safety Insignia Device may be found within the online Prevention Directorate under Members Only.

Marine Safety Training Program



Like the three-pronged Marine Safety M-Pro Pin shown above, the Marine Safety Training Program, formerly known as the Trident Training Program, is a three-pronged training, consisting of education, qualifications, and service. Courses required include Introduction to Marine Safety and Environmental Protection (a two-point AUXOP course), Good Mate, ICS 100, 200, 210, 700 and 800. Members must earn four qualifications from a list of those found on the Prevention Directorate website and then provide a minimum of 96 hours of service each year for five years as recorded in AUXDATA II. This pin indicates a high degree of knowledge, proficiency and dedication, as well as professionalism on the part of the wearer. Ω



The Marine Safety Training Ribbon was created in recognition of the considerable and long-term, sustained effort that Auxiliarists must put forward in order to earn the Auxiliary

Marine Safety M-Pro Pin. The ribbon recognizes achievement in the marine safety, security, and environmental protection mission area as a precursor to achievement of the Auxiliary Marine Safety M-Pro Pin.
