PUBLIC EDUCATION UPDATE

Another Public Education year has come to an end. Throughout the year we had some ups and downs. We scheduled four About Boating Safely (ABS) classes for the year. We were forced to cancel two due to a lack of students. However, we were able to book an unscheduled class in August that was a great success. We held three ABS classes with a total of 24 students. The largest class was the one held at the Leesburg Boating Club with a total of 17 students. Of the 17 students, 12 were less than 17 years old. All of our ABS classes maintained a class average score in the mid 90's.

We also held our second annual Boating Skills and Seamanship (BS&S) course at Lake Technical College in Eustis. This 13-lesson course was conducted on Wednesday evenings from 1830-2130 hours from February to May. We started with six students and ended up graduating five. All students scored well on the final exam.

Moving forward, we will host another BS&S class at the college during Spring 2020. This year, we committed to the college very early in the hopes that it would give them time to recruit more students. Also, we have launched a Mobile ABS Course where we take the course to various boating organizations, HOA's, social organizations, marinas and first responders, and others. We continue to face fierce competition from the FWC online course. It is difficult to recruit students to attend the 8-hour course at our meeting place. We will look at all possibilities of holding the ABS class in the coming year.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank all our instructors for their hard work throughout the year in both courses. Also, we welcome our newest instructors, Frank Jackson and Bob Musco, to the team.
