V. Business meeting led by David Neal:

- A. Call for additional agenda items (members wishing to have items discussed must submit for addition to the agenda). No additional items submitted.
- B. Guest introductions: No additional new guests. Auxiliary Flotilla 61 member Al Juliachs, Auxiliary Unit Coordinator for Station Miami Beach and SO-Member Training, visits the meeting and will give an update on Division and training activities.
- C. Approval of meeting minutes: August 2016 business meeting minutes circulated for consideration. Motion to approve: First, by Bob Hopps; Second by Stan Flanders. Minutes approved by acclimation.
- D. Member welfare: Flotilla member Sharon Goessel passed away. Sharon was a Flotilla Commander for Flotilla 65. Members are asked to sign a condolences card to send to the family. Flotilla member Alfredo Nardi is not feeling well. Alfie sends his regards and appreciates the card the Flotilla sent to him. No other member welfare.
- E. Division meeting report: There was no Division meeting. Al Juliachs reviewed Division activities:

The Division picnic is coming up at Bill Baggs park on Key Biscayne. On Tuesday nights some Auxiliary folks go to Bird Bowl for a social activity. Division Commander Roger Kidder wants to encourage more fellowship among the membership.

Al Juliachs is putting together awards and recognition for members who worked on upgrading Station Miami Beach.

There is a need for more Navigation Aids Verifiers. Only eight verifiers are available in the area of operation. The verifiers have set up a tracking system for verified lights. We are the only Division that's put in this large amount of work

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verifying aids, looking for discrepancies, and also working with NOAA to update charts. Al suggests for more people to get qualified and get involved. If you are out in a boat or on the shoreline, you can call in any discrepancies to a Navigation Aids Verifier.

The Auxiliary Food Service program is growing and looking for more members to take the training and become qualified. The training is currently located in Clearwater, but All is looking into setting up a training school at Station Miami Beach

The Mandated Training can be done online through AUX-Learning, at the CG National Testing location.

Coast Guard Auxiliary is considering starting a program for paddle craft and kayaks, and canoes. If members want to develop a program they will need to take a lead to get a program off the ground. There are paddle craft clubs with mostly online events. Perhaps the Auxiliary could launch a paddle craft safety program.

Issues with Auxiliary boat crew requalification are being looked into to review the setting of standards by the USCG Active Duty. The new station Commander wants better qualification standards. For example, night operations qualification currently occurs in a limited training area in Biscayne Bay. The Commander wants a more expansive training area to be covered. However, this would create more time and effort to get night operations qualified.

VI. Reports. Committee Reports:

- A. Change of Watch 2017 Enrique Ventura reviewed research results on locations. The Hilton and Aerosquadron are too expensive. Bahama Breeze is lunch only and has no accommodation for a room for doing presentations. The most conducive location with the right presentation equipment for a room and for our needs and with the appropriate atmosphere to hold the event is the Miami Shores Country Club. The date was secured for the Sunday in the third weekend of January. Enrique encouraged everyone to participate in the event. If members have issues or they wish to express their concerns about such things as the location, cost, transportation, or other concerns, you may see Enrique privately and give him your feedback if you wish to do so. The cost for the brunch at the Miami Shores Country Club is about \$32.00. The attire is Tropical Blue uniform or Business Attire. We may need approximately 30 or more people to attend to keep a fair price. Frank Sullivan made a motion to submit a deposit to the Miami Shores Country Club. Motion received a first by Scott Blumenthal; a second by Jim Scholz; motion approved by acclimation.
- B. Elections Tony Lapicola, committee leader, was unable to attend the meeting. The Elections will be held at the November meeting and we will need a quorum.
