Purpose of Auxiliary Awards

- No wages or other direct compensation
- Essential to the success of the Auxiliary program
- Considered to be nominal payment
- Auxiliarists should receive the appropriate recognition and awards to the maximum extent possible



Individual Awards



Earned by a member in recognition of an individual contribution or effort.

Auxiliary Distinguished Service Medal



The performance required to justify this award is exceptional performance of duty, which benefits the Auxiliary as a whole.

Auxiliary Legion of Merit



Performance must be clearly much higher than normally expected, and must have a measurable, positive effect on the Auxiliary across multiple Districts or at Auxiliary Area or National level.

Auxiliary Plaque of Merit



This award recognizes heroism in the face of grave personal risk which clearly stands out as above normal expectations.

Auxiliary Meritorious Service Medal



The meritorious performance of duty must have enhanced Auxiliary goals and be of a nature much higher than that normally expected.

Had a significant positive effect on the ability of the Coast Guard and/or the Auxiliary to complete its missions and goals.

Auxiliary Medal of Operational Merit



This award recognizes outstanding achievement or service of an operational nature (defined as direct, hands on, underway, surface or airborne aviation mission activity) worthy of special recognition.

Auxiliary Commendation Medal



This award recognizes outstanding achievement or service worthy of special recognition. The key words for the Auxiliary Commendation Medal are outstanding achievement, which significantly furthers any of the Auxiliary's authorized activities.

Auxiliary Achievement Medal



This award recognizes outstanding achievement or service of a nature, which is worthy of special recognition.

The key words for the Auxiliary Achievement Medal are sustained professional leadership achievements and period of time.

Auxiliary Letter of Commendation Medal



The award is intended for Auxiliarists serving in any capacity with the Coast Guard or Auxiliary for a superior act of service resulting in unusual and/or outstanding achievement.


The award can also be used to recognize an Auxiliarist's service/performance for a special event or project.

Auxiliary Sustained Service Medal



This award is presented to an Auxiliarist contributing a documented total of 750 volunteer hours of Auxiliary service. Subsequent awards are presented for each additional 750 hours of service.

U.S. Coast Guard Unit Awards



Earned by all members participating in a particular event.

Coast Guard Presidential Unit Citation



For meritorious achievement and outstanding performance in action from 29 August to 13 September 2005, Hurricane Katrina Response.

Coast Guard Commendation Ribbon



To be eligible, an Auxiliarist must have participated directly in at least 50% of the action in a single operational incident for which the Coast Guard unit involved received a citation for one of these awards.

Coast Guard Meritorious Unit Ribbon



To be eligible, an Auxiliarist must have participated directly in at least 50% of the action in a single operational incident for which the Coast Guard unit involved received a citation.

Coast Guard Meritorious Team Ribbon



- Auxiliarist must have made a significant contribution to a team cited for the award.
- Team can consist of Auxiliarists and CG Active members, or all Auxiliarists.

Auxiliary Excellence "E" Ribbon



The Coast Guard Auxiliary Excellence "E" ribbon will be issued to those team members who earned the Operational Excellence Program E-Decal award

Service Awards



Earned in the performance of a particular duty or service Based on time entered into AUXDATA.

Coast Guard Special Operations Ribbon



Auxiliarists who participate in a Coast Guard special operation not involving combat, may receive this award.

Auxiliary Humanitarian Service Award



The Auxiliary Humanitarian Service Award is awarded to Auxiliarists who participate in the same operations where Coast Guard active duty personnel are awarded the HSM.

Auxiliary Recruiting Service Award



The Auxiliary Recruiting Service award is awarded for recruiting seven or more new members into the Auxiliary.

Coast Guard Recruiting Ribbon



Auxiliarists must complete the Coast Guard recruiter PQS and have augmented a recruiting office for two years to qualify.

Auxiliary Specialty Ribbon



Any Auxiliarist who has satisfactorily completed any of the specialty courses.

After earning the AUXOP device member may no longer wear the Specialty Ribbon.

Auxiliary Operations Program

The Operations Program Ribbon is authorized for members who qualify as any of the following:

Pilot

Aircrew

Air Observer

AtoN Verifier

Coast Guard Watchstander

Coast Guard boat crewman

Coast Guard boat engineer

Auxiliary Interpreter



Marine Safety Training Ribbon



Auxiliarists who successfully complete the following tasks are entitled to wear this ribbon:

- 1. Intro to Marine Safety and Environmental Protection
- 2. Good Mate Course.
- 3. ICS100, ICS 200, IS 700, and IS 800.
- 4. ICS 210 (Coast Guard taught) or ICS 300
- 5. One Auxiliary Marine Safety Program PQS.

Examiner Program Ribbon



Auxiliarists who qualify as a VE, RBSV, or a CFVE may wear the Examiner Program Ribbon.

Instructor Program Ribbon



This ribbon recognizes qualification in the instructor (IT) program.

Auxiliary Member Service



This award is presented to any member who completes five cumulative (*need NOT be consecutive*) years of Auxiliary membership

Flotilla Meritorious Achievement



- This award is given annually to one flotilla in each district or region.
- Must be a member of the flotilla for six months and a day during the award period to be eligible.

Public Affairs Specialty Ribbon



Awarded to Auxiliarist who achieve the certification of Auxiliary Public Affairs Specialist

VE/RBSVP Service Performance Award



This award is for completing a total of 60 or more vessel examinations, program visits, 20 or more examinations of commercial fishing vessels, uninspected passenger vessels, and/or uninspected towing vessels.

Auxiliary Public Education Service



Complete thirty or more hours of instruction in (PE or MT) Serve as an instructor's aid for sixty or more hours

Auxiliary RBS Device



120 points per year for two consecutive years in the following missions:

- PE Missions
- VE Missions
- PV Missions
- Certain PA Missions
- Certain Outreach Missions

Auxiliary Operations Service



200 hours of Operational Support activity "S" device 60 or more hours surface mission activity "O" device 30 or more hours Airborne aviation activity "O" device 200 points of Marine Safety Missions "M" device

Making a Recommendation

- Any Auxiliary member may make an award recommendation.
- Active military and civilian personnel are encouraged to make award recommendations.
- Use the chain of leadership and management
- All except the ADSM, ALOM, APOM, and the Flotilla Meritorious Achievement Medal.
