CURRENT BOATING SKILLS & SEAMANSHIP SAFE BOATING PROGRAM SCHEDULE

Flotilla 78 has a **12-week repeating cycle** Safe Boating Program every **Tuesday, 7:00-9:00 PM**, **arrive for the first time at 6:30 PM to register**. You can start at any point in the cycle. Cost is \$80 per person (\$40 each additional person sharing materials). Cash/check payment. Records are kept for 2 years to allow flexible attendance. Sit in on any class a second time with no additional cost. Classes are located at **1500 Pass-A-Grill Way, St Pete Beach**.

The program is based on USCG Auxiliary Boating Skills & Seamanship 14th Edition, Boat America Course, Federal, and State Boating Requirements. Additional pamphlets covering boating topics are provided. All materials are included in the cost of the program.
