Hurricane Harvey

The fall of 2017 was one of the worst hurricane seasons in the US history. Lives were lost and property damage estimates were approximately \$180 billion.

There were eight members of Flotilla 7-4 that were deployed. The team effort supported three missions under mobilization orders for Hurricane Harvey (HH), which included a convoy to get 5 new vehicles into the area from San Antonio to Houston. Convoy Drivers included Alex Shapolavov, Bob Puharic, Lynda Ramos, and Mike & Maya Skibitcky. They were deployed for 24 hours.

Our second team mobilized to Ellington Field in support of air rescue operations. Roberto Ortiz-Diaz and Jeanne McNamara worked between several locations at the air field assisting in the reception of rescue calls, assigning priorities to the air missions, evacuation routes, assigning the pilots and facilities to each of the missions. During this period over 400 missions were completed. The final deployment from Flotilla 7-4 was Robert Dittman and his service dog Jackson who were deployed for 9 days, to assist the JAG office in Houston. To all the members of 7-4 who deployed and those who supported them in San Antonio: "BZ" - "Bravo, Zulu" for a job well done!
