PROTOCOL = Procedure,

Etiquette, Code of Behavior

Show respect and courtesy at all times.

It generates respect and courtesy in return.

We are the Coast Guard's Auxiliary

Part of the Coast Guard Family

The actions, or miss-actions, of just one member reflects on all of us.

We owe the C.G. respect and courtesy

Learn C.G. Customs, Etiquette, and Regulations

The public can't tell us apart.

When do we Salute?

Do we salute each other?

Do we return salutes?

Must we be in Uniform, covered (hat) and outside to salute?



Return a salute with a salute and greeting

Right hand smartly raised till tip of forefinger reaches lower part of headdress or forehead. Palm down, hand, arm & wrist straight.

Flag passing in parade

Face Flag, Salute at moment of passing, hold till past.



National Anthem played and Flag displayed

Face flag and salute at first note of Anthem. Hold to last note

Flag not displayed

Face music and act as if flag was there

Morning Colors at Station or Cutter at Dock

At 5 minutes to 0800

Announced - "1st Call to Colors"

This means the flag will be raised in 5 minutes – all quiet inside and out. If outside, be sure you have your hat on, if you don't want to stand and salute go inside. Make no noise.

Morning Colors at Station or Cutter at Dock – cont.

At 0800 "call to colors" is given
If outside and in uniform, stand at
attention face the flag pole and salute as
the flag is raised - inside stand at

attention.

Civilian cloths, stand at attention. If outside a base in a car or walking, stay there till at attention ceremony is over.

Evening Colors

Same procedure as morning except done at actual Sunset

"1st call to colors" and Call to Colors are given before this ceremony takes place

If outside and in uniform covered, stand at attention face the flag pole and salute while the flag is raised or lowered. If outside a base in a car or walking, stay seated or standing, at attention, till ceremony is over.

Civilian Salute – no uniform



Same timing as in uniform but Place hand over heart and remove hat.

Do not salute

New Federal:— If you are a past member of the Armed Forces, not in uniform, outside & covered when flag passes in a parade or is raised or lowered at a military instillation you may salute.

Saluting as Group Formation or Ceremony

On Command "Execute Hand Salute"

Show Respect when Saluting Do it Correctly REALLY BAD SALUTES!

- Not at attention when saluting
- Saluting with left hand in pocket
- Failure to look at the person or flag being saluted.
- Saluting with the left hand

"C" School Behavior

Wear proper uniform, hat & outer wear for the prescribed uniform! Know when to take off and put on your hat.

Know when and how to salute

Abide by all the rules

Fill out travel claims honestly



When do you wear a hat?





Square on he head, no hair hanging down

When do You Wear a Hat? When do You Take it Off?

- *In Uniform Outside —as you leave a building/cutter, put it on.
- *Take it off going inside

Some outside areas may be considered a no hat area – Air Station btw buildings.

Boarding a Cutter or ship

- 1.Face aft and salute the flag from the gangway before turning to the OOD, salute and say "Request permission to come aboard sir (or ma'am).
 - 2.00D will return your salute and invite you aboard. If no 00D just go aboard after saluting the flag



Leaving a Cutter or ship

1. Present yourself to the OOD, salute and say "Request permission to leave the ship sir" (or ma'am)

(or ma'am)
2. After OOD has returned your salute, step to the gangway. As you cross the gangway turn aft and salute the flag and go ashore. If no OOD just salute the flag and leave.

Notes on boarding



In uniform - If the flag isn't flying, face in the direction where it would be (aft) and salute.

Boarding - If in civilian clothes don't render a salute – face the flag and stand at attention for a moment, turn to the OOD and ask permission to board.

Leaving in civilian clothes

Follow the same procedure as if you were in uniform but omit the salutes

If you are in uniform and your guests are not – only you need to ask permission to disembark and salute the flag.

CG Senior Officers Protocol on Entering Military Vehicles, Cutters

Enter first and leave last

Cutter - Crew will be assigned a positions and "Attention" will be called and every crewmember renders a hand salute.

Their pathway must be kept clear.

Wardroom Etiquette – where senior officers eat

Invited – if sit down meal –Capt, XO or Senior Officer = *invites* to sit

If have to leave, ask permission. Don't discuss religion, shop talk, politics or sensitive subjects.

Chief's (CPO) Mess

In "CPO Country" – *invited* to enter No hats.

Also- Do not enter Crew Quarters, Captain's quarters without invite.

C.G. Station/Office Etiquette

It's the C.G.'s place of business and, for some, stations, their home.

We are "Family" Guests

They may be involved in activities - (a case, training, paperwork etc)

Make an Appointment if Important Don't just sit around to talk.

Station Etiquette

Don't walk in like you know everything. You don't!

You can make suggestions in a nice way but in the end it is the CG's call

Your actions and attitude can reflect on all Auxiliarists.

Station Etiquette

If under orders and asked to do something you can't safely do, explain why. Otherwise do as asked. Find out reasons later.



Auxiliary Funeral Honors



Auxiliary Funeral Honors

Notify FC immediately.

FC – contacts the family with condolences and assistance. Determine if AUX participation is desired.

Don't pressure the family – explain the options.

- 1.Pay respects as a group.
- 2. An Honor Guard posted at the viewing.
- 3. A brief memorial service or participation in the funeral itself.

The family's wishes are paramount - don't cause hard feelings by being persistent

As a Group – all AUX walk single file slowly to the casket each stop and salute the casket - flag. Smartly turn to the left or right (depending on what direction was decided upon before and leave the area slowly.

Casket Watch – two Members at a time in Bravo's & Combo Hats

Slowly walk up center isle or one on either side of seating toward the casket. Stop at casket –salute the flag on casket. Split left and right around, one to the head and one to the foot. Salute the AUX standing there. They will turn sharply and leave slowly around their side of the room to the back. You will advance to the casket and salute, sharply turn to face the audience stand at attention.

Auxiliary Religious Funeral Service

AUX service available usually done before the Clergy Service - Samples in the Manual - prayers and services for multiple Religions
